H. Nov Begins with brisk breezes at E. S. E.  
4<sup>th</sup> 1831 In fine weather at 4 P.M. put off  
He got a whale saw several more  
at 4 P.M. took him alongside  
Middle & Latter part strong breezes  
He hauled got in the body of the  
whale saw ship John Howland  
So ends this day Lat 9° 12' Long 88° 40'

Lat Nov Begins with strong breezes at S. E.  
5<sup>th</sup> 1831 In cloudy rough weather at 5 P.M.  
and gear out finished putting at 7 began to boil  
Middle & Latter part fine weather  
Saw nothing remarkable  
So ends this day Lat 9° 04' Long 88° 35' Chas

Sun Nov Begins with strong breezes & fine weather  
6<sup>th</sup> 1831 Hood to the south saw ship John Howland  
Middle & Latter part strong breezes  
He hauled at 4 P.M. finished boiling  
70 barrels saw 3000s & one finback  
So ends this day Lat 9° 15' Long 88° 15'

M. Nov Begins with strong breezes at E. S. E.  
7<sup>th</sup> 1831 In good weather Hood to the S. E.  
Middle part wind weather the same  
hauled to the south Latter part  
moderate breezes & very pleasant  
So ends this day Lat 9° 15' Long 89° 02' Chas

Thurs Nov Begins with brisk breezes & very pleasant  
8<sup>th</sup> 1831 Hood to the S. E. Middle & Latter part  
strong breezes & cloudy weather  
at 8 A.M. saw a ship to the east  
So ends this day Lat 9° 06' Long 88° 15'

Henry Cleveland Ship Leonidas  
W. Nov Begins with brisk breezes at S. E. E.  
9<sup>th</sup> 1831 In cloudy weather Hood to the south  
with all sail Middle & Latter part  
strong breezes hauled to the S. E.  
at 2 P.M. saw nothing remarkable  
So ends this day Lat 9° 34' Long 88° 10'

Thurs Nov Begins with strong breezes at E. S. E.  
10<sup>th</sup> 1831 In cloudy weather Hood to the S. E.  
saw two finbacks at 5 P.M. hauled  
to the S. E. Middle & Latter  
part strong breezes & cloudy weather  
at 3 P.M. hauled to the south  
So ends this day Lat 9° 10' Long 88° 14'

Fri Nov Begins with brisk breezes at S. E. E.  
11<sup>th</sup> 1831 Cloudy weather Hood to the south  
Middle & Latter part strong winds  
In squally weather at 6 P.M. saw  
ship John Howland putting  
saw many blackfish  
So ends this day Lat 10° 24' Long 89° 00'

Sat Nov Begins with strong breezes & squally  
12<sup>th</sup> 1831 weather at 1 P.M. saw sperm whales  
to windward going quick to windward  
Middle & Latter strong winds  
In squally rough weather  
at 10 P.M. saw sperm whales  
gave chase with the boats but  
could not keep sight of them  
So ends no obs Lat 10° 30' Long 89° 20'
