

Coast of Peru kept by
Sun 13th Regins with strong breezes and
Nov 1831 squally weather - Saw several
Sperm whales at 6 P.M. struck
one & lost two lines -
Middle & Latter part fine weather
at 6 A.M. Saw Sperm whales put
off & got one at 10 began to cut
So ends this day Lat 10° 11' Long 88° 57'

Nov 14th Regins with moderate breezes and
Nov 1831 fine weather at 3 P.M. finished
Cutting at 5 Saw more whales
put off two boats but night came
on & could not strike -
Saw a ship to leeward -
Middle & Latter part wind and weather
the same - at 5 P.M. began to boil
So ends this day Lat 10° 13' Long 88° 57'

Nov 15th Regins with pleasant breezes
Nov 1831 at 2 P.M. stood to the South
at 3 P.M. saw many large
whales struck one & parted the
line - Middle & Latter part
wind & weather the same at
10 P.M. finished boiling -
at 6 A.M. saw more whales put
off & got one 60 barrel whale
& commenced Cutting -
So ends this day Lat 10° 55' Long 88° 57'

Cleveland Ship Leonidas -
Nov 25th Regins with light winds & fine
Nov 1831 weather at 1 P.M. saw a large whale
put off & struck him & broke
the iron - Middle & Latter part
wind & weather the same
So ends this day Lat 10° 50' Long 89° 10'

Nov 26th Regins with brisk breezes & fine
Nov 1831 weather stood to the S.E. at 6
P.M. tacked to the N.E. under
short sail - Middle & Latter brisk
breezes and cloudy - Saw nothing
Remarkable - So ends this day
Lat 10° 00' Longitude by Chron 89° 00'

Nov 27th Regins with brisk breezes at E.S.E.
Nov 1831 and cloudy weather - stood to the South
Middle & Latter part squally weather
at 4 A.M. saw a large whale put
off two boats and got him at 10 took
him alongside & began to cut
So ends this day Lat 10° 14' Long 89° 10'

Nov 28th Regins with brisk breezes & squally
Nov 1831 weather at 4 P.M. finished Cutting
& stood to the North - at 2 A.M. tacked
to the South - Middle and latter part
strong winds and squalls of rain -
at 6 A.M. commenced boiling -
So ends this day Lat 10° 52' Long 89° 24'

Nov 29th Regins with brisk breezes at E.S.E. & squally weather
Nov 1831 stood to the South under short sail - at 6 P.M. tacked
to the N.E. Middle & Latter part strong breezes
& rough squally weather at 10 A.M. saw
4 or 5 Sperm whales put off two boats
& killed one - Saw some finbacks -
So ends this day Lat 13° 00' 10° 30' Long 89° 10'
