

Sunday? Coast of Peru kept by Henry
January 1832 Begins with brisk breezes at E. S. E. 33.
fine weather stood to the S. E.
Middle to latter part much the same -
saw nothing remarkable -
So ends this day Lat 9° 53' Long 88° 12' Chr

Mon 2^d Begins with brisk breezes at east to fine
Jan 1832 weather. stood to the S. E. with all sail
saw a ship to windward clearing to the south
with all sail. Middle to latter part moderate
breezes - at 6 P.M. saw a ship to the head
saw blackfish. So ends Lat 9° 01' Long 87° 19' Chr

Tue 3^d Begins with light breezes at S. E. to fine weather
Jan 1832 Middle to latter part the same - at 6 P.M.
Spoke ship Logan of New Bedford 15 months
out. 1000 barrels reports the following ships
Loan 60 barrels 7 months out Lima 30.6 do
Whistlow Middle Dec 600 Balena 850.14 do
Cortez 200 Magnolia 700-12 months out
Francis Henrietta 1450-2 years
Charles 800 Victory 1500-8 do -
Mayflower 6 months -
Lidia 150 Nov - Trident 170.5 months out
Rebecca Sims 2600 Dec bound home
Phoenix N. Bedford 450
So ends this day Lat 9° 58' Long 88° 30'

Wed 4th Begins with fine weather to brisk breezes
Jan 1832 Middle to latter part light winds -
saw blackfish -
So ends Lat 10° 00' Long 88° 34' Chr

Thursday 5th Begins with light winds to fine weather
Jan 1832 Middle to latter part the same - saw blackfish
So ends this day Lat 10° 15' Long 87° 11' Chr

Fri 6th Begins with brisk breezes at E. S. E. to fine
Jan 1832 weather. stood to the S. E. with all sail
Middle and latter part wind S. E. to fine weather
at 1 P.M. saw a ship to windward - at 2 P.M. saw
a ship off sea quarter - saw many blackfish
So ends this day Lat 9° 11' Long 85° 56' Chr

Sat 7th Begins with brisk breezes at S. E. to fine
Jan 1832 weather. stood to the S. E. saw a fin whale
at 6 P.M. tacked to the southward -
Middle to latter part wind to wind
the same at 8 P.M. tacked to the S. E.
So ends this day Lat 9° 01' Long 85° 32'

Sun 8th Begins with fine weather to moderate
Jan 1832 breezes at S. E. at 5 P.M. saw a
large sperm whale at 6 put off
two boats but could not strike -
Middle to latter part brisk breezes at 2 P.M.
tacked to the S. E. at 6 P.M. a large
whale from appearance the same
whale we saw yesterday put off two
boats but could not get near him
at 9 P.M. went out of sight to windward
So ends this day Lat 8° 16' Long 86° 00' Chr

Mon 9th Begins with brisk breezes at S. E. to fine
Jan 1832 weather. Middle to latter part light winds. saw no fish
So ends this day Lat 8° 51' Long 85° 14' Chr
Long 85° 11' Lunar obs
