

Coast of Peru - Ship Leonidas
Feb 4th 1832 Bregins with brisk breezes at S. E. and
fine weather - saw many sperm whales
put off to sea and one to draw the iron
Middle & latter part strong breezes -
at 10 A.M. finished boiling
So ends this day Lat 11° 13' Long 79° 05' Chs

Feb 5th 1832 Bregins with strong breezes at S. E. and
weather clear to the N. E.
Middle & latter part brisk breezes
saw finbacks & Whalers -
So ends this day Lat 11° 10' Long 79° 20' Chs

Feb 6th 1832 Bregins with brisk breezes at S. E. and
fine weather - Middle & latter part
light winds. at 8 A.M. saw many whales
right off & got one 30 or 40 barrel whale
So ends this day Lat 11° 08' Long 79° 30'

Feb 7th 1832 Bregins with light winds and fine weather
Cut in the whale & made sail -
at 6 P.M. commenced boiling -
Middle & latter part wind & weather
the same. Latter part employed stowing
down oil & boiling - saw 2 h. hammers
So ends this day Lat 11° 05' Long 79° 35'

Feb 8th 1832 Bregins with light winds & fine weather
at 6 P.M. finished boiling - Middle
& latter part wind and weather the same
So ends this day Lat 11° 34' Long 79° 25' Chs

Feb 9th 1832 Bregins with light winds and fine weather
employed starting iron hoops -
at 10 A.M. Middle & latter part wind and weather the same
saw the finished blowing down the air. made 14th
land
So ends this day Lat 11° 05' Long 78° 43' Chs

Feb 10th 1832 Capt by Henry Cleveland
Bregins with light winds & fine weather
stood off shore - Middle & latter part wind
& weather the same - saw nothing remarkable
so ends this day Lat 11° 34' Long 79° 24' Chs

Feb 11th 1832 Bregins with brisk breezes at S. E. and
fine pleasant weather. cleared S. W.
employed fitting cutting blocks &
rearing new falls. Middle & latter part
wind and weather the same. -
at 6 A.M. saw sperm whales at 9 put off
with the boats struck two whales killed
one & drew from the other -
at 11 took the whale alongside and began
to cut - So ends this day Lat 11° 22' Long 79° 40'

Feb 12th 1832 Bregins with moderate breezes at S. E. and
very pleasant. at 5 P.M. finished cutting
saw more whales right off with the boats
& got one at 8 P.M. took him alongside
Middle & latter part wind and weather
the same. at noon got in the body
of the whale. More whales in sight
So ends this day Lat 11° 06' Long 79° 30'

Feb 13th 1832 Bregins with light winds and variable
took in the junk and put off two boats
50 whales in sight all the time -
at 3 fastened to one and killed one
at 5 took him alongside. Middle &
part calm - latter part cut in the
body of the whale -
So ends this day driving log works
Lat 11° 02' Long 79° 27' Chronometer
