

Remarks on Board Thursday July 15-1831

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at S E and squally at 1 P.M. saw the whale about three of best soon lost sight of her stood on to the Westward untill 5 P.M. then tacked to the Eastward but saw nothing of the whale Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather the same saw Finbacks So Ends with Ship's Duty Lat by Ob 5-27 S

Remarks on Board Friday 15

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at S E and Cloudy at 6 P.M. shortened sail Middle and Latter part the same at 6 A.M. made sail steaming by the wind to the Eastward one Ship in sight saw Finbacks and Plumpbacks and Sunfish So Ends Lat by Ob 5-35 S

Remarks on Board Saturday 16

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at S E and Cloudy weather steaming by the wind to the Eastward Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather the same at 10 P.M. tacked Ship to the Westward at 2 A.M. tacked back & gain one Ship in sight saw Finbacks and Plumpbacks So Ends with Ship's Duty Lat by Ob 5-22 S

Remarks on Board Sunday 17

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at South and Cloudy steaming by the wind to Eastward at 2 P.M. saw the Land at 6 shortened sail and move Ship Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather moderate at 6 A.M. made sail at 7 spoke the Ship Ann Alexander Captt Cleveland And let him have a spar for a main Top Gallant yard So Ends the Land 12 Leagues Distant Lat by Ob 5-29 S

Remarks on Board Monday 18

First part of this 24 hours moderate breeze from S E to S W steaming S E at 6 P.M. shortened sail and stood to the Westward by the wind Middle part the same with some Rain Latter part fresh breeze and thick weather at 6 A.M. made sail and tacked to the Eastward at 11 A.M. saw the Land at Noon the Land about 7 Leagues Distant Lat by Ob 4-51 S

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 19-1831

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at South and thick weather run down of with Cape Blanco at 5 P.M. took in the Top Gallantails and Double Reefed the Top sails and took in the Mainsail and halled off by the wind Middle and Latter parts the same So Ends with Ship's Duty Lat by Ob 4-21 S

Remarks on Board Wednesday 20

First part of this 24 hours moderate breeze from S E to South steaming by the wind to the Westward saw Blackfish leaved and got one Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather the same at 11 A.M. saw Spinn whales leaved and got one So Ends with a thick fog No Ob

Remarks on Board Thursday 21

First part of this 24 hours moderate breeze from S E to S W and thick of fog cut in the whale at 6 P.M. shortened sail at 7 tacked Ship to the Eastward Middle and Latter part the wind and weather much the same at 5 A.M. began to Boil at 8 A.M. tacked to the Westward So Ends all hands employed Boiling Lat by Ob 4-28 S

Remarks on Board Friday 22

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from S E to South and thick weather steaming by the wind to the Westward at 9 P.M. finished Boiling Middle and Latter parts the wind the same and the weather squally at 4 A.M. wore Ship to the Eastward saw Finbacks and Grampasies So Ends with a strong current setting to the S W Lat by Ob 3-49 S

Remarks on Board Saturday 23

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at S E by S and Cloudy steaming by the wind to the Eastward Discovered the hawth of the Triguicks to look very Bad halled the back down and lay a new hawth and then built it up & gain Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather the same at 6 A.M. tacked Ship to the Westward saw Blackfish and Finbacks So Ends with Ship's Duty Lat by Ob 3-27
