

Remarks on Board Sunday July 24 - 1831

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at S E by S and cloudy steaming by the wind to the Westward at 6 P.M. shortened sail at 8 tacked Ship Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather the same at 11 A.M. turned the reefs out of the Top sails and set the Main Top Gellant rail saw Black and Finbacks So Ends

Remarks on Board Monday 25

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at S E and thick of fog steaming by the wind to the Eastward saw Finbacks at 10 P.M. tacked Ship to the S W by S Middle and Latter parts the wind the same and weather something better at 10 A.M. saw a Ship at Down spoke the Ship American Capt Myer with 300 So Ends

Remarks on Board Tuesday 26

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at S E by S and cloudy with late squalls of Rain steaming by the wind to the Westward Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather the same at 6 A.M. tacked Ship the American in Company So Ends with Ships Duty

Remarks on Board Wednesday 27

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at S E and squally steaming by the wind to the Eastward the American in sight Middle and Latter parts more moderate Cooped out Oil and set it down between decks in hopes to get some more soon So Ends

Remarks on Board Thursday 28

First part of this 24 hours moderate breeze at S E and cloudy steaming by the wind to the Eastward at 10 P.M. tacked Ship Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather the same the American in sight So Ends with Ships Duty

Lat by Ob 4-29 S

Remarks on Board Friday July 29 - 1831

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze at S E and cloudy steaming by the wind S W Middle and Latter the wind and weather the same at 10 A.M. saw a number of Spinn whales going to windward very quick tacked for them but soon lost sight of them windward tacked again to the Westward at 11 A.M. saw more whales to leeward kept the Ship off for the whales So Ends all in readiness to bear the American in sight

Remarks on Board Saturday 30

First part of this 24 hours fresh winds at S E and cloudy lowered our Boats and Chased boat could not strike came on board and took up the Boats and made sail in hopes to overtake them but they ran west out of sight to windward at 6 P.M. shortened sail Middle part squally at 10 P.M. tacked Ship to the Eastward Latter part late breezes at S E at 6 A.M. made sail and tacked Ship to the S W So Ends with Ships Duty the American in sight

Remarks on Board Sunday 31

First part of this 24 hours moderate breeze at S E with fog steaming by the wind to the S W at 6 P.M. shortened sail Middle part the same Latter part fresh breezes with squalls of fine Rain at 7 A.M. tacked Ship to the S E So Ends with Finbacks So Ends

Remarks on Board Monday August 1

First part of this 24 hours fresh breezes at S E and cloudy steaming by the wind to the S E Middle part the same Latter part fresh breezes at S E with squalls of course fog too Ships in sight at 10 A.M. saw whales part of two Boats no Ends in Chase

Remarks on Board Tuesday 2

First part of this 24 hours fresh breezes at S E and cloudy Drum before the wind after the whale the Boats in Chase at half past five the Boats came on board and gave up Chase took in the Main Top Gellant rail and reefed the Top sails Middle and Latter parts more moderate at 6 A.M. made sail saw Blackfish Humpbacks and Finbacks So Ends
