First part of this 24 hours Calm Middle the same
Latter part N E breeze from S E to S S E and pleasant weather
made all sail and stood in for the Harbor of Guernsey
So Ends the Harbor 25 Miles Dist 10 by S

Remarks on Board Thursday ¹ March

First part of this 24 hours moderate breezes at S E
And pleasant weather stood in to weather of the
Harbor and spoke a Brig and got information
About the Encourage Middle part lay of and on Latter
part the wind N E stood in handy and lay aback
And went in with the Boat and rounded and put
down a Brig So Ends saw a Ship standing to the
Southward and a number of small Craft

Remarks on Board Friday ²

First part of this 24 hours moderate breezes at S E
at 1 P.M. the Boat came on Board. Bowed full and
stood into the Harbor and came to Anchor in 7 1/2 fathoms
water the weather fair and hailing S.W. and the Lee point
S.W. Middle part Calm Latter fresh breezes all hands
employed in getting of water So Ends one small Craft
at Anchor in the Harbor

Remarks on Board Saturday March ³ 1832

First of this 24 hours moderate breezes and good weather
employed getting of water Middle part Calm Latter part
N E breeze from the Southward one watch on Liberty and
the remainder sweeping and blacking the Bricks So Ends

Remarks on Board Sunday ⁴

First part of this 24 hours N E breezes and good weather
one half the crew on Liberty and the remainder employed
in Ship's Duty at 2 P.M. the Brig Nanawan came in
And came to Anchor Middle and Latter parts the same

Remarks on Board Monday ⁵

All this 24 hours N E breezes and pleasant weather at 3 P.M.
the Governor and his family came on Board and Capt.
Palmer and his Lady of the Nanawan one half of
the crew on Liberty and the remainder employed
in Ship's Duty So Ends got some Potatoes and Bump

Remarks on Board Tuesday ⁶

First part of this 24 hours moderate breezes and good
weather one half on Liberty at 6 P.M. sent the Boat
on shore for the Liberty men of which six of them
were Absent. John S. Franklin Deserted from the
Boat after I gave him orders not to leave her
And afterwards returned and was furnished for it
William Slacum Charles Staitle Thomas Roach
John C. Bridgel Spungarn and native of the
Sandwich Islands Middle and Latter parts the
wind and weather the same at 10 A.M. John S. Franklin
And William Slacum came on Board at 11 A.M. Capt.
Cleveland went on shore and called on the Authority
of the Place for assistance to get his men So Ends
