Remarks on Board Thursday th 16

All this 24 hours moderate breezes at South and thick weather
All hands employed cutting wood and getting of the same
And other necessary jobs at Noon the Ship Foster of
Santucket Capt Clark came to Anchor in the Harbor

Remark on Board Friday th 17

All this 24 hours moderate breezes at S.S.E. and thick Raining
weather. all hands employed getting of wood and storing it
away at 3 P.M. a small Schooner came in to Anchor
So Ends Gardner Tompkins some thing better

Remarks on Board Saturday th 18

First part of this 24 hours like breezes at S.S.E. and
good weather at 2 P.M. finished mending at 6 A small
Schooner came in to Anchor Middle and Latter parts the
wind and weather the same at 8 A.M. the Crew went on
Shoar on Liberty So Ends

Remarks on Board Sunday th 19

First part of this 24 hours moderate breezes at S.S.E. and
good weather the Crew on shoar on Liberty at 6 P.M. the
Crew came on Board Middle and Latter parts the wind
And weather the same at 9 A.M. took the Anchor and
made all sail and left the Harbor of Salango at Noon
A de la Plata having North Distance 16 Miles So Ends

Remarks on Board Monday August th 20 - 1832

First part of this 24 hours moderate breezes at S.W. and good weather
steering by the wind to the Westward with all sail spread to
the best advantage. the Ship Foster and Oregon in Company.
stowed the Anchors and Revoiled the Cables away Middle and
Latter parts the wind and weather the same. Thomas Francis
sick So Ends

Lat Ob = Lon 82-10

Remarks on Board Tuesday th 21

First part of this 24 hours moderate breezes at S.W. and
good weather at 1 P.M. tacked Ship to the S.E. Middle and
Latter parts like breezes from South to S.S.E. and foggy.
steering by the wind to the Eastward employed repairing
A Boat at 10 A.M. wet the Flood. saw Finbacks one Ship.

Lat by Ob 2-3 S Lon 81-20

Remarks on Board Wednesday th 22

First part of this 24 hours moderate breezes at S.W. and
Cloudy weather at 6 P.M. tacked Ship to the Westward. Middle
And Latter parts strong breezes at S.S.E. and thick weather
saw whales two of the weather Bow going to windward
very quick So Ends one Ship in sight Lat Ob = Lon 82-30

Remarks on Board Thursday th 23

First part of this 24 hours moderate breezes at S.S.E. and
Cloudy weather. steering by the wind to the Westward
Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather the same
at 9 A.M. tacked Ship to the Eastward So Ends with a good
lookout

Lat by Ob 3-22 Lon 83-15

Remarks on Board Friday th 24

First part of this 24 hours fresh breezes at S.S.E. and Cloudy
weather. steering by the wind to the Eastward at 3 P.M. saw
whales to windward leaved but could not fasten at 6 saw
Ship and took up the Boats took in the Top Gallant sail
Reased full and stood to the Westward at 11 tacked Ship
Middle and Latter parts the wind and weather the same
at 6 A.M. made sail and wet the Flood So Ends with
Ships Duty at Noon saw whales Lat by Ob 3-34 Lon 83-00
