

Remarks On Board Ship Leonidas

1857 L. M. Commences with light breezes from
Thursday O. N. W. & some foggy middle & later part
2nd of Novemb lively breezes & flying clouds first part
steering to south later part heading to the
westward saw 3 ships & a number of
finbacks & few birds latitude $35^{\circ}34'$
longitude at 3 part meridian by Chro $25^{\circ}24'$
by lunar $25^{\circ}09'45''$

Friday 3 All these 24 hours lively breezes from the North
& fair weather first part spoke ships Stanington
of O. London 250 sperm & Blackstone 1 whale
later part Chaist 4 white whale & could not
fascen saw several sail most of them whaling
latitude $35^{\circ}44'$
longitude at 2 part merid $25^{\circ}41'$

Saturday 4 All these 24 hours strong breezes from O. N. W.
to O. N. W. & several squalls under Double
reefs & hole 2 sails first part saw 5
ships O. barque to the windward took a
whale along side Chaist 4 whale & could not
fascen later part Chaist 2 whale could not
fascen & ships in sight latitude $35^{\circ}48'$
longitude at 3 part meridian $25^{\circ}27'$

Sunday 5 All these 24 hours strong breezes from the
O. N. W. & some squalls later part Chaist
2 Wright whale & could not fascen saw
a good many ships saw the barque to
the windward several ships Chaist whale
without success latitude $35^{\circ}56'$
longitude at 3 part merid $25^{\circ}25'$

Monday 6 All these 24 hours strong O. N. W. winds &
squally weather first part under single reefs
later part Double reefs L. M. land for a
whale without success saw several ships
whaling & saw no ship blue down
latitude $34^{\circ}55'$
longitude at 3 part meridian $25^{\circ}34'$

Tuesday 7 All these 24 hours strong winds from O. N. W.
to O. N. W. & some squally at 8 wore ship to the
North later part saw several finbacks
unbent M. D. G. sail & bent another in its place
so ends these 24 hours under Double reefs ship heald
sight first part spoke ship herald sailing harnet & even
latitude $34^{\circ}19'$ longitude at 4 part merid

Cruising In The S. Atlantic Ocean 1857

L. M. Commences with strong W. S. W. winds
Wednesday & passing Cloudes heading to the S. W. under Double
reefs & courses at 1 board all 3 boats for a gam
of 3 Wright whale without success at 5 saw a
good number of finbacks at 6 board for 1 whale
without success at sunset shortend sail for the
night heading to the South ship herald in sight
at 12 middle part wore to the westward at 5 30
O. M. board for a whale at 7 board for 2 at 9
board again for 2 all without success the whale
are as shy as the Devil so ends these 24 hours
all sail set heading to the westward Wind
S. W. & pleasant with smooth sea so sail in sight
latitude $35^{\circ}58'08''$
longitude at 2 part meridian $25^{\circ}28'44''$

L. M. Commences with light S. W. winds & pleasant
weather saw 3 Wright whale going to the westward
part at 1 tacked ship to the S. S. E. at 4 spoke
Thursday Barque Clarisa Clarke Newbedford 14 months
9th out 2 white & 1 sperm whale at 8 wore ship to
the westward at 8 O. M. board struck & got a
wright whale took him along side & commenced
cutting so ends these 24 hours with a light breeze
from the South & pleasant weather several
whale in sight at 4 Distance latitude $33^{\circ}49'$
longitude at 6 part meridian $25^{\circ}15'$

L. M. Commences with light breezes from
S. S. E. pleasant & smooth sea board for whale
without success finesht cutting & started
Friday the works took in sail for the night the watch
10 Employed in bailing later part fine breezes
from the S. E. & fine weather steering to the S. W.
all sail set saw a barque of the sea barn
saw a Chaist 1 whale so ends these 24 hours
all hands employed in bailing latitude $33^{\circ}36'$

All these 24 hours fine breezes from the South
Saturday & pleasant weather all hands employed in bailing
11 first part standing to the westward later
part to the S. W. saw 2 ships & no whale
latitude $33^{\circ}42'$
longitude at 4 part merid $25^{\circ}41'$
