1838 Off these 24 hours light breezes from East
Clear & pleasant weather Steering S.W. first
Tuesday part saw 4 ship ahead of later part
Saw 2 ships spoke ship Ann Bishop
January Sagharbour 400 hulls of whale Oil saw ship
Edward Hudson 2 seasons 1000 saw plenty
whale board struck & held 4 whale 2 miles
to the windward

Off these 24 hours light breezes from the
East & pleasant weather at 7:30 took the
Wednesday rope along side & cut him in started
the works & took on sail for the night
Off 9 A.M. raised 4 dead whale lat 10
took him along side & commenced cutting
to ends these 24 hours & plenty whale in
sight & 2 ships cutting

P.M. Commences with light breezes from East
& pleasant weather All hands employed in
cutting Off 4 finest cutting board & toate struck
Thursday Drawd the whale out of to windward & hauling
4th blood could not get fast again middle
part strong breezes cloudy & some light
rain later part light breezes & fair all
hands employed in hauling 3 ships in sight
& hauling saw nothing but finbacks latitude 36° 24'

P.M. Commences with lively breezes from N.E.
& some foggy 3 ships in sight the spoke ship
carries up Sagharbour 6 whale middle
Friday part rain ends with strong gails & some
5 rain all hands employed in stowing Diving
Down & hauling 2 ships in sight saw 1 whale

first & middle part of these 24 hours strong
gails & rainy weather with some fog at 2 P.M.
Could Down on the account of rain spoke ship
Saturday Bengall of Salem 36 Days out Capt Jackson
threw board the Indian Ocean for ship in whale
later part more moderate & fair started
the works at 12 sat P.M. 3 sails aboard
backs aboard wind N.W. 3 ships in sight

latitude 36° 53' S

long at 2 P.M. merid 23° 00' W

first & middle part of these 24 hours strong
breezes & fair weather at 7 P.M. finished hauling
Sunday later part light breezes from N.W. & calm all
hands employed in stowing Down 1 ship in sight
first part 2 saw 1 spoke a whale of our sea
standing to the N.E. all these 24 hours

latitude 36° 26'

longitude at 4 P.M. merid 22° 28'

Off these 24 hours light breezes from S.E. to
East & fair weather first part standing to
Monday the N.E. Off 4 P.M. finished stowing Down
3th later part heading to the S.E. saw 1 whale & passed
to 2 whale & drew 2 ships in sight to windward

latitude at 3 P.M. merid 22° 35'

first & middle part of these 24 hours light
breezes from N.E. to N.W. & pleasant weather
Tuesday steering S.W. picked up a head of bone on
9th at Carcas later part strong gails & mostly
cloudy at 8 o'clk of 32 saw 1 ship sailing
as plenty finbacks & no white whale the whale
watch employed in cleaning bone latitude 37° 30'

longitude at 5 P.M. merid 22° 27'

Off these 24 hours strong gails from N.W.
to West first part rainy steering S.E. at 3 P.M.
Wednesday kept to the wind starboard back aboard under Cloast
10th keep 7 sails 3 sails & mizen later part clear
with passing clouds saw 2 whale & some birds

latitude 38° 30'

longitude at 4 P.M. 21° 4'
