

On Board Ship *Leornidas* in August 1838

Wednesday 18th of April 1838

first part of this day strong land breezes
& clear later part light sea breeze went
ashore & got a full look Starboard watch & shore
on liberty. Crewed Ship & crew

Thursday 19th All this day light breezes from its usual
quarters & fine weather larboard watch
on liberty

Friday 20th this day light land breezes & strong
sea weather pleasant weather Starboard
watch on liberty

Saturday 21st this day lively land & sea breezes
& pleasant weather larboard watch
on liberty

Sunday 22nd this day Commences with light breezes
from South & hazy weather at 3 P.M.
called all hands have short set the 3 sails
& weigh anchor in company with ship
Franklin & barque. Hoisted up & weighed
made all sail with a lively breeze from
South lashed the anchors on the bows
onboard the chains & slung them below
at a sandy island bore SE dist
3 miles by estimation strong wind
& heavy sea from S.W. took in
3.4 sails & double reefed 3 sails part of
ship & miles of our sea standing in to
the bay got all 3 boats ready for whaling
so ends this day including 12 hours

Long at 3 P.M. 43° 11'

Monday 23rd Commences with fresh gails from
South weather good at 3 took in gail at
4 Closest reefed 3 sails at 2 P.M. more moderate
turned one reef out the 3 sails wind SE
ends with light breezes from S.W. &
weather pleasant & a rough sea at 11 part
of ship 21 miles of the sea standing to the
South so ends here 12 hours Franklin in sight
of the sea here Long at 4 P.M. 42° 27' Lat 43° 33'

From St. Augustine Bay to Cruise of L. O'Connell

Tuesday 24th of April 1838

first part light breezes from S.W. to S.W. by
fine weather middle & later part from West
& some hazy steering South all sail set

Latitude - - 26° 00'

Long at 3 P.M. 43° 33' E

Wednesday 25th P.M. Commences with light breezes from
SE & S.W. some cloudy at 3 the wind halled
to the South took ship middle part fresh
breezes & some squally at 4 & 5 P.M. Closest reefed
3 sails fresh gails & strong squalls attended
with rain ends some clear Lat

Thursday 26th P.M. Commences with fresh gails from
SE & S.W. cloudy at 2 more moderate
turned one reef out the 3 sails set gail at 6
squally took in gail later part more
moderate under single reefs wind S.W.
& overcasts at high swell from S.W.

Latitude 28° 35' S

Long at 3 P.M. 41° 41' E

Friday 27th first & middle part of these 24 hours
strong breezes from S.W. to South &
passing clouds under single reefs later
part more moderate turned out all reefs
& set M. & G. sail at 11 P.M. took
ship to the S.W. ends with fine weather

Latitude By Obs 31° 03'

Long at

Saturday 28th first part lively breezes & passing clouds
at 4 P.M. raised 1 sail of the sea here
at 6 spoke her which proved to be the ship
Franklin that said in company with
us from the bay middle part frequent
squalls attended with rain at 4 P.M. hard
squalls & rain double reefed 3 sails ends
with fresh S.W. gails & passing clouds

Latitude 29° 12'

Long at 3 P.M. 41° 39'
