

Ship Lucudas From St Augustin Bay

Sunday 29th of April 1838

first part Strong gails from S.E. & passing Clouds At 6 P.M. wore ship to S.E. with Cross reef & courses later part more Moderate Sat got & turned one reef out the 7 sails Saw 4 pinback Latitude

Long at 2 P.M. merid 41° 07'

Monday All first part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from S.E. mostly cloudy middle & later part light baffling breezes flying & overcasts wind from S.E. to S.S.E. Watch Employed in Ships duty & Observation

Tuesday All these 24 hours light breezes from S.E. & day at 10 A.M. & passing Clouds At 2 P.M. backed ship to the E. & E. the Capt. well hand but not as stout to be seen Latitude

Long at 2 P.M. merid 41° 02'

Wednesday first part light breezes from S.E. clear & 2nd pleasant weather middle part light airs & Calms later part light breezes from East at 9 P.M. backed ship Latitude

Thursday first part lively breezes & fair middle & later part fresh gails from East to E.S.E. L. 3rd with passing Clouds under Double reef 7 sails L. 2 sails Aboard Latitude

Friday first part Strong winds from East to E.S.E. & passing Clouds middle part squally & showery Coast reef 7 sails at 6 A.M. turned one reef out the 7 sails at 8 wind shifted to S.W. Ends with lively breezes & fair Latitude

Saturday All these 24 hours fine breezes from S.E. & S.W. to N.E. & W. middle part some squalls & rain the rest fair & clear S.E.

All these 24 hours lively breezes from S.W. & fair weather Steering S.E. M. 3rd sail set Saw nothing Latitude

Long at 2 P.M. merid 48° 04'

Monday All these 24 hours fresh breezes from the South & passing Clouds Course S.E. & S. All sail set that would draw to advantage Saw nothing Latitude By Obs 25° 30'

Long at 2 P.M. merid 48° 58'

Tuesday All these 24 hours fine breezes from S.S.E. to E.S.E. & pleasant weather At sunset took in 7th & 8th sails Double reef Main set boats Crews watches Course North at 9 P.M. kept to the wind At Daylight called all hands maid sail Steered S.E. & S. with the remainder part of the Day Latitude

24° 11'

Wednesday P.M. Commenced with lively breezes from S.E. & passing Clouds Steering S.W. At 3 P.M. raised the land ahead one degree to the North of P. Dauphin at sunset Shortland sailed & headed off to South & S.E. all night with barboard tack aboard at Daylight called all hands set back 7 sails with 4 strong E.S.E. wind the land all plain in sight kept of West at 9 halld up to the wind S.W. & W. Wind S.W. & S. Saw 4 sail of our sea how running down the coast So Ends under E. reef 7th & 8th sails Double reef Main 7th & Mainsail fird standing in about 12 miles from land Latitude

25° 10'

Long at 2 P.M. 47° 13'

Thursday All these 24 hours fresh gails from S.E. to North at 1 P.M. wore ship 7 miles from the land standing of all these 24 hours under short sail heading up S.E. to E.S.E. A rough sea on weather fair Latitude

15° 53'

Long at 4 P.M. merid 48° 22'

Friday first & middle part of these 24 hours strong breezes from North some squally & lightning at 8 P.M. wore ship later part more Moderate Sat M. 3rd sail the weather fine the sea misting smooth & not a whale to be seen hard is our luck
