

Remarks On Board Ship Leonida

Wednesday 5 of September

First & middle parts lively breezes from N.W. clear middle part & light clouds passing from the western board & some lightning at 5 P.M. wind shifted in a squall to N.E. & closed down & doubly rapt ends with lively breezes from S.W. with rain heading S.E.
No Observation

Thursday 6

From 24 hours commence with strong light S.W. breezes rainy weather middle & later parts strong double reef breezes specially attended with smart showers of rain abundant about 11 A.M. Stairsail & Mizzen to repair so ends with passing clouds wind South
Capt Stuart is quite smart Latitude 31° 16'

Friday 7

Long at 2 30 P.M. 48° 31' E
First part fresh breeze from South passing clouds middle light & bapling all sail set later light from S.E. weather fine sea smooth & good number of whale herds around the ship first part finished & bent Mizzen & Stairsail later abundant mainsail to repair so end larboard tacks aboard

Saturday 8

First part small breezes from S.E. weather fair bent mainsail abundant M. D. G. sail Condensed it & bent another middle part Calm at 1 30 P.M. A lively breeze sprung up from E.S.E. squared the yards course South overcasts later part lively breeze from N.W. & overcasts watch employed in sundry gobs about rigging putting on chipping gear saw a sulphur bottom Latitude 31° 30'

Sunday 9

First part lively breezes from North overcasts middle light rain at 5 30 P.M. heavy rain at 4 wind shifted to N.W. Moon broke out at 5 wind N.W. cleared away trimmed all sail to the wind & lively breeze ends clear & pleasant wind light course South at swell from N.W. Latitude 33° 08' not but a few birds to Long at 2 30 P.M. 51° 51' 30"

From Augusteen Bay Towards Whalege

Monday 10 of September 1835

First part light West Winds passing clouds middle bapling light showers at intervals at 6 P.M. saw a sail of weather bee ends with light South breezes & passing watch employed in repairing a boat & sundry other gobs all sail set Starboard tacks Abroad

Tuesday 11

Long Latitude 34° 03' N
First part lively breezes & squally with light showers of rain middle light bapling from S.E. & calm later small breezes from West clear weather course South watch employed in sundry gobs painted a boat & saw a sail bearing E.S.E. some whale birds in sight Latitude 34° 14' Long at 8 30 P.M. by Chron 32° 07' E

Wednesday 12

By Lunar 51° 51' 30"
First part lively breezes from S.W. & fair at 10 P.M. tacked ship wind S.E. ends with fresh breezes & passing clouds watch employed in ship's duty Latitude 35° 18'

Thursday 13

First part strong breezes from E.S.E. passing clouds at 2 double reef at 5 took in the sail 10 at 6 30 clost reef & reef to course at 10 strong galls took in S. & M. S. sails cloudy & dirty weather later more moderate light showers at intervals wind E.S.E. under clost reef S. & M. S. sails double reef M. & courses larboard tack aboard heading S.E. First part saw finbacks watch employed in ship's duty Our Commander is in good health once more but has not yet gained full strength but is in a fair way for it he eats heartier & is fleshier than he has been the voyage before Latitude 36° 04' Long at 2 30 P.M. 54° 07'

Friday 14

All these 24 hours fresh galls from N.E. to N.W. & mostly cloudy under clost & double reefs course E.S.E. saw nothing but a few birds Latitude 35° 42' Long at 8 A.M. by Lunar 53° 12'
