

Remarks On Board Ship Leonie

Wednesday 31 of October 1858

First & Middle parts hard gails from South rainy later more moderate with broken clouds at 5 P.M. Stairsail heading from SW by W to West Ends wind SW 2 ships in sight of sea bar the Messenger & Barque Cavalier Salem first part turned up & hoisted.

I am in hopes to get a whale tomorrow Latitude 34° 25'

Thursday 1 of November Long at 3 P.M. by Chron 64° 22'

First part decreasing gails from NW by W & passing clouds standing to SE were at 2 ship Messenger & Barque Cavalier of our sea bar at 6 sail at 6 turned one reef out M.T. sail Middle more moderate later good whale weather saw six lowered without success So Ends without success Latitude 34° 25'

Friday 2 Long at 5° 50' P.M. 65° 07'

First part fresh breezes from NW passing clouds at 4 tacked ship to SE at sunset lowered & hoisted a whale took in sail Middle fresh gails later part strong gails & some rain heading NW No observation

Saturday 3 First

First & Middle parts fresh gails from NW rainy weather at 6 P.M. were ship to North later more moderate at 8 P.M. saw 2 whales struck & drawn from one Wind SW weather good



Long at 8 A.M.

Latitude 34° 31' 65° 58'

Sunday 4

First part fine breezes from NW saw several whales lowered struck killed took along side one at 5 P.M. & cut him in Middle part light airs from North & haze later commenced hailing saw 2 whales lowered without success Ends fresh gails from NW & haze took in sail

Latitude 34° 58'

On Whaleroinder Indian Ocean

Monday 5 of November

First part strong gails from NW at 2 rainy could down took in T. sail at 9 P.M. more ship to NW & E wind NW Middle & later parts hard gails & heavy squalls attended with rain Wind NW by W heighing to under E reef M.T. sail M. Stairsail & Mizen the sea high turned the sea boat up Latitude 34° 40' S

Tuesday 6

First & Middle parts hard gails from NW by W & passing clouds heading to the NW & W later part more moderate at 6 started the works at 10 set C.M. T. sail turned one out the main Ends with no whale weather

Latitude 34° 18'

Wednesday 7

On these 24 hours strong gails from NW by W to NW & passing clouds standing to SW at 8 P.M. finished hailing & commenced stowing down in after hole

Latitude 34° 48'

Thursday 8

On these 24 hours fresh gails from NW & passing clouds at 3 P.M. finished stowing down were ship to NW & E later part set double reefs saw one whale to rough to lower part 2 ships in sight one of weather how the other of clear one hailing So Ends heading to NW Latitude 35° 38'

Friday 9

First part fresh gails from NW rainy took in sail were ship at 5 wind shifted to NW more moderate later part strong gails & hard squalls attended with rain one ship in sight at 10 P.M. wind NW were ship split 2 M. Stairsail in a squall absent & hint of rain one

Latitude 34° 28' S

Saturday 10

First & Middle parts strong gails from NW & squalls later more moderate at 6 reefs at 11 lowered for a whale without success & saw 2 more set back at 1 P.M. saw a high swell Long at 8° 20' P.M. by Chron

Latitude 35° 1'
