

Wednesday 2 of January 1889

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First part Strong gails from West & passing
 Clouds Middle part More Moderate wind
 (W N W) & Enclende to the North Later Strong
 breezes from North & Clauday Sat @ reef
 1/2 Sails & Courses heading W N W anhent
 Alde M Sail & bent @ new One Saw
 Limbacks & No Observation there 2 hrs

Thursday 8

First part fresh gails from North W.
Cloudy Middle part Strong gails & rain
took in sail later wind light thick heavy fog
W. A high swell from N.W. saw several small
bunches of small kelp heading to the NW & W
all these 24 hours No Observation

Friday 4

First part fresh breezes from North & thick fog under C reefs heading WNW at 6 took in L & M. T sails. Middle part Wind NW & no fog but squally & some rain at 5 Sat C reef T sails at 7³⁰ m. More up & run SW strong gails from North & squalls of hail. A high sea running. Latited at 9³⁰ m 46° 20'.
 Latited at 12 noon 46° 39'.

Saturday 5

First part fresh gails blown North & heavy squalls of hail & rain steering SW at 3³⁰ pm took in S. T. sail & foresail & hove to heading to the westward at 4 took a heavy squall bobbed the stailsail & goeswingd the M. T. sail During the night heavy gails & heavier squalls attended with hail & rain later more moderate At high sea running at 4 P.M. wore ship & sat halld home S. M. T. sheet Latitude 46° 48' N

Sunday 6

First part light breezes from NW
& hazy middle fine breeze from North
Cloudy under double reefs Steering H.B. E
at 9 P.M. Strong gails & rainy took in
sail & have 100 Saw several pinbacks
Ends with fog No observation

Monday 7 of January 1839

Commenced with strong North winds with rain
 & fog at 4 P.M. wind shifted to S.W.
 Small breezes fog cleared out & sail on
 reef out M.D. sail kept of SE saw finbacks
 light breezes & fine during the night at
 4 A.M. halled up South Maide all sail
 at 8 outside 2 wright whales cornered & took
 one along side at 11 strong breezes clear
 & rugged saw several more Latitude 47° 9'
 Long at 8 A.M. By Chron 65-19 W
 By Lunar 67-23

Tuesday 8

First part Strong breezes from N.W.
A clear weather rough sea All hands Employed
in Cutting at 3 so finest Sat Double reefs
Middle part more moderate weather fine
wind N.W. & Starving to the East at 6 P.M.
wore ship to the N.W. Strong breeze from N.E.
& Cloudy Ends with fresh gale & mostly
Cloudy hailing at 6 P.M. Commenced Latitude 47° 38'

Wednesday 9

First part strong gails from N.E.
 & rainy weather at 2 took in 1st sail
 all cold. Down at 4 - P.M. wind shifted
 to N.W. were ship to N.E. Middle strong
 gails & cloudy later wind W.S.W. & passing
 clouds to rough. to boil the thermometer
 stands on 39° rather cool Latitude 44° 19'
 at 4 P.M. saw a R whale Long at 2 P.M. 68° 38'

Thursday 10

1st Part Strong gails from W & W
at 4 More moderate but I sail started the
marks at 10 were S by at 2 P M Boiling
Moderate fog & light rain later Employed
in Stowing Down at 11 were Ship to 8 E
Strong gails & rainy field I sail No Observation

Friday Oct

1st First & middle parts strong gale from North
& rainy weather at 3 finished Stowing Down
at 9 AM. Stave 2 Casks of oil one on the Shuttle roolde
2nd whatever the 1st Chock & back over the 2d Comins
going to & Down below on the first riders the other fetcht
away whilst Coopersing Ended over struck the Coaming
rod out one head now we are in a pretty Condition
