 Calm Middle light breeze from North
 & Clear later light breezes from NE to
 ENE Sat AM Shading sails & a royal
 Embent Main & Sail & repaired
 Middle Sticht it bent another to
 Ends Course NW By W Latitude 24° 54'

Tuesday 21st Long more
 All these 24 fine breezes from
 ENE to ESE All sail set to best
 advantage Course NW By W W 9 AM
 Boarded the Premackidile Brig Commerce
 of Boston Bole Commanded 11 Days
 from Bangau Bound to the Cruise
 bought one bl at Potatoes May Come
 vary Exceptable about this time to Ends
 Employed in Painting Boats & other
 jobs Latitude 26° 11'

Wednesday 22nd Long at 2 PM By Lunar 61° 21'
 By Chro 61° 43'
 All these 24 hours fresh breezes from
 East to ESE passing Clouds All sail
 set to the best advantage Course NW
 By W So Ends watch Employed in
 Ships duty saw great quantities of Gulf
 weeds Latitude 27° 33'

Thursday 23rd Long at 3 PM By Lunar 64° 15'
 By Chro 63° 46'
 All these 24 hours strong winds from
 East to ESE Middle part Squally took
 in Shidingsails later passing Clouds Sat
 7 AM & lower 4 sails So Ends watch
 Employed in Sundry gabs of Ships duty
 pump some Oil Course NW By W Latitude 29° 19'

Friday 24th Long at 2 PM 65° 11' 15"
 All these 24 hours lively breezes from
 East to ESE Clear & pleasant weather
 at 8 AM Boarded Schooner Minton
 & Son & Days from Plymouth Bound
 to St. Cruz lumber loaded So
 Employed in ships duty

Saturday 25th of May 1839
 First part lively breezes from NE middle
 light weather fine Ends with Calm this day
 finished filling Ship Course NW By W
 one Sail in Sight Latitude 32° 04'

Sunday 26th Long at 2 PM 68° 50' 4"
 First & Middle parts Calm later
 small airs from West Clear & pleasant
 2 Sail in Sight broke out & conspered
 about sixty bls of oil Petive ndicks
 which had leaked about 4 bls of whale oil
 Latitude 32° 13'

Monday 27th All these 24 hours light SW breezes
 Clear & pleasant as May at 3 PM boarded
 the Schooner Baltimore of Newhaven & Days
 from New York Bound to Nassau Owerford
 for Fine apples & got papers & potatoes from
 her Long at 2 PM 69° 11'

Tuesday 28th Long at 8 PM 70° 11' 15"
 First part lively breezes from SW
 Middle fresh Sun & Sparish Brig at
 1 PM Stearing East at Midnight at
 Ship Crast all wake later Strong
 breezes & flying Clouds took inn 1 of
 Lower & Main T. Mast Shidingsails
 & 1 Mizen T. G. Sail Latitude 35° 26'

Wednesday 29th Long at 2 PM 70° 16'
 Commenced with strong breezes from SW
 & chazy at 4 30 fresh sails squally & some
 rain Double reef T. Field Mainsail at 7
 wind SE field Mizen T. Sail Middle
 part more moderate turned out one reef
 & sat in T. Sail at 4 30 some more more
 moderate turned out all reefs Sat 3 PM
 & T. T. M. Shidingsail wind SSW squally
 looking weather during the night later with
 lightning in the north Course NW By W at 5 PM
 water 78° by thermomater varied during the night
 from 75 to 76 at 8 AM wind shifted to NW
 Double reef So Ends No Observation
 Latitude By D R 37° 10'
