

Ship Leonidas towards

Sunday July 19th 1840

First part light trades from East Star & pleasant weather middle & later lively breezes & fine, but no whales under all sail steered by the wind

Latitude By Obs 16° 41' S

Long at 4 P.M. Merid 114° 25' E

Monday 20th

All these 24 hours lively trades & fine weather under all sail steered to the N.E. by the wind ship Portland insight astern

Latitude 15° 14'

Long at 9 A.M. Chro 114° 47'

By Lunar 115° 57'

Tuesday 21st

First part fresh breezes at 8:30 P.M. the Dayland 10 miles off our sea quarter saw her keep off we did the same we ascertained after that she saw 2 large sperm whales going fast to N.W. middle strong trades & brought forth fore & aft S.G. sails at 10 A.M. more moderate set then steered to N.E. & N.E. by the wind

Long at 8 A.M. Chro 115° 55'

Wednesday 22nd

All these 24 hours light trades fine clear & pleasant weather steered to N.E. by the wind to N.E. under all sail but no sperm whales Capt Stuart is afflicted with very bad rheumatism or scurvy pains in the legs Joseph Demmeck has the scurvy is not able to perform duty & several others has it touch of the scurvy

Thursday 23rd

First part light trades middle & later strong weather fine steered by the wind till 1:30 A.M. then N.W. These 24 hours water green

Latitude 10° 46'

Long at 4 P.M. Chro 116° 59'

Friday July 24th 1840

All these 24 hours lively trades from S.E. & fine at 11 P.M. took in S.G. sails hauled up courses & came to with main yard aback at daylight made all sail & steered North lat 6:30 saw the land through the smoke at 12 Merid 116° 31' Point of Lumbawa bore N.W. Dist 6 miles by Estimation

Saturday 25th

First part strong breezes & fine steered into Ollas Strait about 12 miles thought it to be Lamboc not having any chart on a large scale & the Chro not to be depended on made one board to the East then tacked & was out clear before night the tide setting very strong Ebb to the South fell in with 18 spokes the Portland she was also steering for the straight tacked off & on for the night under topsails double reefed in carrying with said ship at daylight found the current had set us about 15 miles to leeward made sail & run down the land for Lamboc Straits saw 6 large merchant ship ahead middle strong breezes later more moderate at 12 Merid 116° 31' Point of Lamboc bore N.W. Dist 4 miles Bally Peak insight Lamboc shot in

Sunday 26th First part lively trades at 1 P.M. hauled into the Strait & met a very strong tide run about 5 knots got up about 10 miles at sunset opened the bay but had no chart on a large scale & did not run up tacked about all night at daylight was nearly out of the Strait made all sail the breeze small at 9 A.M. smart breeze sprung up saw ship Mary standing out to sea at 12 Meridian the bay was opened the bay was foggy was slow at 2 P.M. got in by the N.W. point where the tide is not so rapid took 4 lively breezes at 5 came to anchor with the banner in 10 fath water field sails got up & set by daylight
