

Remarks Ship Leonid

Wednesday Feb. 3rd 1840

All this day moderate breezes from South to East and fine weather. Earl watch on liberty. Starb. employed in ships duty. painted Starb. bends. Set up main T. mast rigging royal &c. Arrived Barge Superior Wilmington 4:50 p.m.

Thursday 4th

All this day lively breezes from South to SE and fine weather all hands employed in ships duty. Stowed down the remainder of the water. Sailed Ship Condore for Swanriver

Friday 5th

First part lively breezes from land middle strong from SW & Clear all hands employed in Sunday gals of ships duty. Painted the ships Stern ment Ashbar with one boats crew for Mahogany to make a set of belaying pins. Shift 2 Canashers

Saturday 6th

First and later fresh breezes middle light and calm all hands employed. In Sunday gals of ships duty. Shift 2 Portuegiles from Shoar that was cast away in ship Samuel White. Sailed Ship Jefferson Mary Metsey Baker & Barge Harvest Fisher Wilkens left the ship about 10 P.M. in same boats and took all his wearing apparel

Holland

Sunday 7th

First part lively breezes from land. At 6:30 A.M. got under way and steered out the bay in company with ship Newark with 4 fine three of the land. Steered W by S at 10. Calm at 12. Merid the land about 12 miles. First ends this Day. Encluding 12 hours

Monday 8th

At 12:30 A light breeze sprung up from SW steered N.W. at 3 & by W with 4 lively breeze going at the rate 6 miles per hour. At sunset took in T.G. sails at 11. Left to head of Shoar with main yard fayed to be 26 miles from Ratenest Island. At Daylight made all sail. Steered N.W. by E by the wind. A light breeze from land. Round to Swanriver for Potatoes. Ends here 24 hours with light air and Calms the land just in sight and Clear & pleasant weather at Merid 20 miles to South of the Island. So Ends very smoky

Tuesday 9th

Commences calm at 4. A light breeze sprung up from NW & steered NW & at sunset took in T.G. sails. halled up courses. Leighed off & on during the night. Middle part strong breeze from SW at 4. At 6 M. Dauble reft at 5:30 took in T & Mx T. sails headed of Shoar at 8. wore ship in strong breezes and rough sea at 10 set T & Mx T. sails. Dauble reft so ends very smoky

Latitude 32° 06'

At 3 P.M. saw Ratenest Island bearing E & E by N and one reef out the T sails. Set Gild. T & Main T. G. sails at 5:30 rounded the N.E. point of garden Island giving the breakers. At suitable berth the course to be anchorage. At 6:05 miles then set S at 8 took at pilot 8:30 Came to Anchor with best bower anchor & 50 fathoms. Chane in 42 fathoms water hard bottom. Jilted the sails set the watch so ends this Day & sea. Encluding 46 hours.
