Ship Leonidas Leighing

Wednesday February 11-1841

First part of this Day & civil
account lively breezes from land and
fine weather at 10 AM Sea breeze set in
later strong breezes & clear but smoky
All hands Employed in ships duty
went fishing & the Capt went to Port
for Potatoes

Thursday 11

All this Day lively breezes from land
& Sea and fine weather Look watch
ashore on liberty Starboard Employed
in secondary gabs of ships Duty
Arrived ship Berkley & friends ship
from Port Lashenalt for vegetables
the Berkley in want of 9 men

Friday 12th

First part fresh sea breezes middle
small land from land & calm later
strong from sea the sea breeze blows
from SW blow generally fresh till
nearly quite midnight the day & half
of shore the land breezes blow generally
fresh in the morning I go away towards
the middle of the Day Calm & is very
warm the sea breeze sets in from NNE
at 2 PM it blows the 24 hours
Look watch Employed in ships Duty
Star on liberty

All these 6 Days Leighing at Anchor in
at Juan river nothing occurred worth notice
weather fine winds from there small
quaters & mostly moderate

herman 3 weeks

At Sea

Saturday February 20th

These 24 hours Commence with fine
breeze from NW Clear & pleasant weather
steered to the West by the wind at sunset
took in sail & set boates true watches
middle fresh breezes later fine weather
steered to South by the wind saw a great
number of porpoises so ends these 24 hours
2 men made there appearance on deck
that came of from shore in same boat
and stowed themselves away

Long at 2 PM Chro 114° 34' Natenest
Island bearing South altered the rate which
gives the Long 115° 30'
Latitude at Merid 32° 30'

Sunday 21 to 27th

First 7 days nothing occurred notable winds from
ESE to NW and fair weather working
to South & west same part of the
fine winds strong from South saw
several merchant ships steering to
NW & one whaler steering to but
no whales the watch has been employed
in various gabs of ships duty made 4
one Mr. B. sail yard on built main & sail
to mend & bent another the Long the
the Long 26th Day 109° 12' the farthest W
this Day 27th 110° 14' Latitude 35° 39'

Sunday 28th

First part strong breezes from South
to see steered ESE at 4 PM Double
sail killed 1 Pig now for 4 fresh
sheep & left to mind saw a whale
ship steering to NW middle fresh
later from ESE at 7 tacked to South
under bare 3 sails Latitude 35° 11'

Monday March 7th 1840

Long by Chro 2° 30' 10' 40'
First part fine breeze from ESE
& fine weather steered South at high
swell from SW middle light & calm
later strong from West & most cloudy
steered East kept down Mr. I. sail & yard
& up 4 new yard at Merid weather looks bad
Olast kept 2 sails
