

Remarks

Sunday April 4th 1841

All these 24 hours fresh gales from SSE to SE & Mostly Cloudy stood to ESE at first part hauling at 10 P.M. finest later stowing Dawn Latitude 27° 57'

Monday 5

All these 24 hours fresh gales from SE fair & rough sea first part headed to ESE middle & later to SEW all hands employed in stowing Dawn Latitude 27° 48'

Tuesday 6

First part fresh breezes from SEW Employed in stowing Dawn at 4 finest & washt the Decks middle same later moderate breezes from SE steered to SEW under hole 7 sails watch employed in sundry's fitting cut gear & Casks etc no whales Latitude 28° 28'

Wednesday 7th

First part lively breezes from SESE & fair steered to SEW middle & later from SESE at 6 P.M. tacked ship to SEW later under all sail to Eastward smoky haze weather Lat 28° 27'

Thursday 8

First part light breezes from SESE Cloudy smoky weather star tacks aboard at 5 tacked to South middle light & hailing later thick & rainy Cabin thunder & lightning No Observations Lat 28° 16'



Friday 9

Commences with fresh breeze from North & thick rain at 3-30 Cleared made sail middle small breezes later light set all sail lowered mast & killed a Sulphur battery he flated took him along side at 12 Merid had him cut in he is as long as an 80 lb Sperm whale but uncommon small blubber from 3 to 4 inch thick & fat so ends at all sail to South clear & very fine Lat 28° 27' Long 107° 18'

Saturday April 10

First part small breezes from West & clear middle fresh from North headed to Eastward later lively from NWSE at 1 P.M. commenced hauling at 10 A.M. finest Latitude 28° 35'

Sunday 11

First part light breezes from NWSE steered to ESE at 3 tacked to NWSE star ship to windward stowing to Westward middle from North & squally with rain later fine breezes from NWSE fine weather under all sail to NWSE 2 ships in sight Latitude 28° 44'

Monday 12

All these 24 hours fine breezes from NWSE & fine weather first & middle stood to NWSE by the wind at 7 spoke ship Therelles Luvier 240 lbs Sperm later steered SE all hands employed in stowing Dawn Lat 28° 27'

Tuesday 13

First part fine breeze from NW steered SE middle from West headed to South later lively from SEW steered ESE but not a whale to be seen Latitude 28° 18'

Wednesday 14th

First part lively breeze from SEW & fine steered NE middle strong from South headed to ESE later strong & squally steered NW under Double reefs watch employed in Ships duty heared out between Decks for room Latitude 27° 12'

Thursday 15th

All these 24 hours fresh gales from SE & squally steered North under Double & single middle under Close reefs watch employed in Ships duty started 6 Casks of bread in pipes Latitude 24° 58'
