

Remarks

Wednesday April 28th 1841

All these 24 hours light winds from SSE to SE & very fine first part all hands employed in cutting at 8 started the works at 8 PM. Saw 4 large sperm whale lamers & boats Chase him till he sunset & could not get past so ends 2 boats in chase & 8 or 10 miles from the ship & she making the best of her way with 2 heads in to & bailing.

Thursday 29

First & middle light breezes from SSE & fine at 4 PM came on board & have in the junks seized by the Cores later baled them bailing all these 24 hours
Latitude 21° 25'
Long at 3 PM 107° 49'

Friday 30

All these 24 hours finely breezes from SE & fair weather steered to SSW by the wind saw finbacks employed in bailing
Latitude 21° 49'

Saturday May 1st 1841

All these 24 hours strong breezes from SE and mostly cloudy first part steered to SSW middle & latter to East Watch employed bailing saw 2 sail to windward
Latitude 21° 34'
Long at 3 PM 107° 21'

Sunday 2

All these 24 hours strong breezes from SE & flying clouds under double reefs at 10 PM finished bailing at 6 PM wore ship to SW all hands employed stowing down
Latitude 21° 26'

Monday 3

All these 24 hours strong breezes from SE and fair all hands employed in stowing down headed to SSW & under double reefs first part saw 4 ship to windward whaling later 2 sail in sight
Latitude 21° 54'
Long at 4 106° 41' 30"

Continued on Board Ship

Tuesday May 4th 1841

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from SSE to SE & fair at 3 PM finished stowing down spoke ship Gulean 338 sperm 200 whale oil steered to Eastward saw finbacks
Latitude 21° 23'

Wednesday 5

First part fresh breezes from SE middle & later light clear & pleasant steered to SSW by the wind 2 sail in sight to windward but none whaling
Latitude 22° 28'
Long at 3 106° 46'

Thursday 6

First & middle small breezes from SE & calm later lively at 8 PM ticked to South under all sail 3 ships in sight saw 4 Sulphur bottom & calf
Latitude 22° 36'
Long at 4 PM 107° 01'

Friday 7

First & middle finely breezes from SE & hazy weather at 2 PM spoke Barke steamer Philman 575 sperm 250 whale 23 months out steered to Eastward later strong breezes & light rain
Latitude 21° 58'

Saturday 8

First part strong winds at 2 PM saw the Pioneer whaling 6 to leeward bore up & run down saw 4 large whale lowered all 3 boats & neither of the 6 boats could get near enough to strike middle & later fresh gales from SE & mostly cloudy at 7 PM wore ship to SSW under double reefs Pioneer off weather quarter
Latitude 21° 34'
Long at 2 PM 107° 31'

Sunday 9th

All these 24 hours fresh gales from SE and cloudy hazy weather the sea rough steered to South under short
Latitude 22° 28'
