

Remarks

Monday May 10th 1841
All these 24 hours strong winds from SE to SE thick cloudy & dirty weather first & middle started to South at 7 AM wore ship to SE under double reef the Pioneer off weather ham sent down 24 main royal masts to fit new rigging saw finbacks Caught 4 good number of Albatross No Observation

Tuesday 11
First part strong winds from SE under double reefs to SE at 5 PM spoke Barque roseo Clark 450 sperm 550 whale the Sam Barque Pantheon take 4 large whale in the fore part of the day to windward middle & later fresh gales & cloudy at 8 AM wore ship to SE under short sail Latitude 22° 15'

Wednesday 12
All these 24 hours fresh gales from SE to SE squally & dirty weather first & middle carried small sail to South & hard rain from 3 PM till 4 at 8 wore ship to SE set C reefs saw 4 sail to leeward first part saw 4 Barque to leeward cutting No Observations

Thursday 13
First part fresh gales from SE squally with light showers headed to SE & under short sail at 5 spoke Barque roseo at 6 wore ship to SE & SE middle strong gales & heavy squalls with hard rain took on all sail but Spencer & Stairs sails later more moderate but squally with showers steered to SE under short sail Latitude 22° 20'

Long at 5 PM 106° 50'

Friday May 14th 1841

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from SE to SE & passing clouds steered to Eastward Caught 4 number Albatross saw 2 barque ships but no whales

Long at 10 AM Chro 107° 15'

Saturday 15 By Lunar - 107° 15'

First part fresh breeze from SE & fair steered to the Eastward by the wind under hole 1 sails middle & later strong from SE & rough sea at 6 AM wore ship to SE & set double reef 1 sails to ends & no whales Latitude 21° 45'

Long at 10 AM 107° 54'

Sunday 16

All these 24 hours strong breezes from SE & fair steered to SE & W first part under double reefs later single reefs saw finbacks at 8 AM saw 4 ship off the beam

Latitude 22° 30'

Long at 10 AM Chro 107° 30'

Long at by Lunar 107° 22'

Monday 17

All these 24 hours lively breezes from SE & fine weather steered to South saw finbacks but no sperm whales

Latitude 23° 35'

Long at 9 AM 107° 10'

Tuesday 18

All these 24 hours lively breezes from SE to East & fine weather at 6 PM tacked to SE later carried all sail 1 sail in sight but no whales

Latitude 23° 05'

Long at 2 PM 107° 30'
