Thursday May 20th 1841

All these 24 hours light trades from SE to ESE Clear & pleasant first & middle steered to South later to NNE Saw 3 Ships
Saw finbacks

Latitude 22° 51'

Long at 2° 50' PM 107° 49'

Friday 21

All these 24 hours light trades from SE to ESE Clear & pleasant weather steered to NNE but no whales
How many more such fair days
It will pass before we shall take
A prize not many I sincerely hope

Latitude 22° 22'

Long at 2° PM 108° 41'

Saturday 22

All these 24 hours light breezes from SE Clear & very fine & smooth sea steered to Eastward but no whales
Saw one ship of weather guate

Latitude 22° 26'

Long at 2° PM 109° 22'

Sunday 23

All these 24 hours small breezes from SE & calm Clear & pleasant first & middle to NNE later steered to Westward so ends these 24 hrs & no whales

Latitude 22° 19'

Long at 2° PM 109° 32'

Monday 24

All these 24 hours light winds from ESE to South Clear & pleasant weather steered to SSW A great number of small fish round the ship but no large spouters in sight except finbacks
Watch employed in ship's duty all well

Latitude 23° 03'

Long at 2° 50' PM 109° 45' 30"

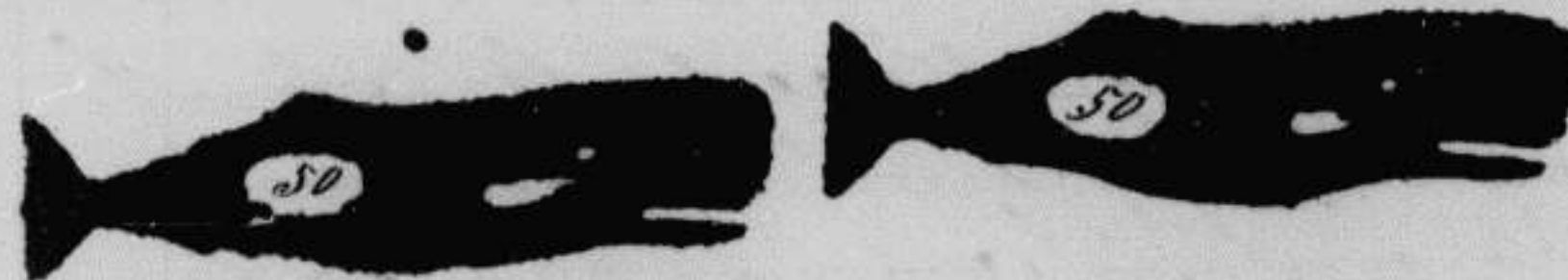
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Tuesday May 25 - 1841

First & middle of these 24 hours lively breezes from SE & fine steered to SSW Saw 3 Ships to windward later strong winds & flying Clouds under single reefs at 4 spoke ship Phoenix
Brigs sagharbaw 1200 whale 300 sperm
Saw a good many hump & finbacks
at 11 steered NW

Latitude 23° 18'

Long at 2° 50' PM 108° 02'



Wednesday 26

First part strong breezes from SE steered NW under single reefs at sunset took in sail headed to Eastward later fresh gales from SE flying Clouds & very rough stored NW ambient
Garsail to repair at 9:30 AM raised whales to leeward lowered struck & killed 2 & got one boate lightly stove at 2 PM had them cabled got dinner
A ship past to leeward under close reefs took in all sail but C reef
M G sail

Latitude 22° 56'

Long at 2° PM 108° 06'

Thursday 27

All these 24 hours strong winds from SE & rough sea at 2 PM took the whales along side got dinner bent Garsail shifted boates & got ready for cutting later all hands employed in same

Friday 28

All these 24 hours fresh gales from SE & rough sea first & later cutting middle hoisting spoke ship Phoenix
Cook A. Bedford 200 sperm
