Saturday May 29th 1871

First part fresh gales from SE
finest Cutting Middle & later
More Moderate Steered to South
boiling saw 1 ship to leeward
supposed her to be the Hercules

Latitude 22° 29'
Long at 3 107° 57'

Sunday 30th

All these 24 hours Moderate breezes
from SE & fair steered to South
Saw several ships spoke ship
Mount Vernon Sherman W. Bedford
Employed boiling

Latitude 22° 31'

Monday 31st

All these 24 hours Moderate breezes from
SE & fair at 2 PM more ship to
WRE at 8 PM finest boiling

Latitude 22° 16'

Tuesday June 1st

All these 24 hours Moderate breezes
from SE & fine at 2 PM spoke
ship Hercules Rickerson cut finest
Cutting 2° 50-60 whales steered to WRE
later to SE & W all hands employed
stowing down saw nothing

Latitude 22° 18'
Long at 3 108° 19'

Wednesday 2nd

First part Moderate finest
stowing down middle fresh later
strong gales from SE & W aware ship
to West under short sail Lat 22° 44'

Long at 3 108° 39'

Thursday 3rd

All these 24 hours fresh gales from
SE & flying Clouds Stead to WRE
first part middle headed to WRE & W
later to WRE under double reefs
Employed repairing boats & c

Long at 2 PM 108° 12'
Latitude 22° 43'

Cruising off N. Holland

Friday June 4th 1871

First part fresh breezes from SE
& fair steered to the North spoke ship
Thermac Starboc Newburyport to Malant
ant 400 sperm 600 whale oil middle to SEW
later to WRE but no whales

Latitude 22° 02'
Long at 2 PM 107° 53'

Saturday 5th

All these 24 hours fine breezes from
SE & fine weather steered to SEW
Saw finbacks later spoke ship
Marcia found home in 4 fuel days
500 sperm 600 whales

Latitude 22° 23'

Sunday 6th

All these 24 hours Moderate breezes
from SE to NE & very fine steered
to SE by the wind saw 4 greater
plenty finbacks a number of ships

Latitude 22° 39'
Long at 3 PM 108° 00'

Monday 7th

First & Middle fine breeze from WRE
& fine weather steered to the East by
the wind later fresh from WRE &
raining spoke Barque Lindus 300 sp 60 W. oil
in want of Dr. J. Mart let her have one
spoke Barque Pantheon 22 months ant 400 sperm
1000 whale oil

Latitude 22° 43'
Long at 2:30 109° 10'

Tuesday 8th

All these 24 hours strong breezes from
West to SE & equally first part steered
to East later WRE saw 4 good number
hump & finbacks but no sperm
Employed mending sails & setting
up shanks

Latitude 22°
Long at 3 109° 39'

Wednesday 9th

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from SE
to SEW & some squally first & middle steered to WRE
later to SE spoke ship
from Garhauer
