

Remarks on Board the Brig Leonidas

Friday August the 27th 1841 Commences with light winds from the S.W. standing to the S.E. 2 sail in sight spoke the Panama no oil since we spoke her last at sun set shortened sail heading W.N.W. at day light made sail and put the Cook on Board the Panama she was Bound for home in 2 days he had a sore leg being of Duty nearly all the voyage so Ends at 12 M. tacked to the Eastward spoke the Lebanon of Cal

Saturday August 28th Begins with fresh Breezes from the S.W. steering E.S. middle and latter part to the N.E. Employed stowing Down stowed down 60 Bbls started one Barrell of Beef so Ends

Latt By Obs. 36. 58 N. Long 42. 31 W

Sunday August the 29th Commences with light winds from the Southward standing to the Eastward at sun set shortened sail at day light made sail 2 sail in sight so Ends

Latt By Obs. 37. 04 N. Long 41. 55 W

Monday August the 30th Begins with light winds from the Southward and fine weather standing to the Eastward at sun set shortened sail at day light made sail steering E.S. so Ends

Latt By Obs. 37. 16 Long 40. 46 West

Tuesday August 31st Commences with light winds and moderate weather wind variable steering to the Eastward at sun set shortened sail at day light made sail wind from the Northward steering East one sail in sight so Ends

Latt By Obs. 37. 04 N. Long 40. 06 West

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Wednesday ^{September} the 1st Begins with light winds from the North steering to the Eastward saw a sperm whale we lowered and put for him the sun set we come aboard shortened sail heading to the westward at day light made sail standing to the westward at 12 M. tacked and steering East so Ends

Latt By Obs. 36. 50 N. Long 39. 40 W

Thursday Sep. the 2nd Commences with fresh Breezes from the N.W. steering East at sun set shortened sail at day light made sail at 11 A.M. saw a large whale at 12 M. lowered

Latt 37. 12 N. Long 38. 51 W

Friday Sep. the 3rd Begins with light winds from the North the Boats down the L. Boat fastened and Starboard Killed him took him Alongside and Began to cut lay By him all Night at day light hooked on took in the By Body lay By the head so Ends
No Observation

Saturday Sep. the 4th Commences with light winds from the North laying By the head Commenced Boiling Middle and latter part the same three sail popped so Ends

Latt By Obs. 36. 56 N. Long 38. 42 W

Sunday Sep. the 5th Begins with light winds from the S.W. Boiling haled up the head cut of the junk and Bailed the Case middle and latter part Boiling so Ends

Latt By Obs. 36. 53 N. Long 38. 10 W

Monday Sep. the 6th Commences with light winds from the S.W. heading to the S.E. Boiling finished Boiling so Ends

Latt By Obs. 36. 41 N. Long 37. 54 W

Tuesday Sep. the 7th Begins with light winds and moderate weather standing to the S.E. middle part the same latter part steering E.S. 2 sail in sight so Ends

Latt By Obs. 36. 54. Long 37. 30 West
