

Remarks on Board the Brig Leonidas

Monday September the 20<sup>th</sup> 1841 Commences with strong gales from the N. N. W steering S. N. E at 3 P. M. took in the fore top sail at 6 P. M. close Reef. the Main top sail and have too heading N. E at day light made the Flores and made sail steering S. N. E for the Is.

Lat By Obs. 39. 20 N. Long 31. 30 W

Tuesday Sep. the 21<sup>st</sup> Begins with fresh breezes steering down the Island a Boat come of and we could not trade made sail for Fayall middle part squally latter part moderate so Ends

Lat By Obs. 38. 56 N. Long 29. 20 W

Wednesday Sep. the 22<sup>nd</sup> Commences with light winds from the S. W and steering S. E Fayall in sight middle light winds and calm weather latter part the same close under Fayall Bent Cables so Ends

Thursday Sep the 23<sup>rd</sup> Begins with light winds from the North steering S. E close to the Island winds light and baffling at 6 P. M. come to anchor in 10 fathoms water of the Town middle part squally latter part Breaking up oil to send ashore so Ends started 1 P. M. of Park

Friday Sep 24<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh breezes from the Northward Breaking out and cooping the oil to send home sent ashore 215 Barrels and 9 1/2 Gallons the Grand Turk of Dartmouth Laying of and on Recruiting 750 Barrels the Agent of New Bedford 100 Barrels so Ends

Saturday Sep 25<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh breezes from the Northward middle light winds latter part from the westward the Starboard watch on Liberty so Ends

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Sunday September 26<sup>th</sup> 1841 Begins with fresh breezes from the W. S. W squally with the west of Edg intown, laying of and on Recruiting 85 Barrels and the John Adams the Massachusetts of Nantucket 2. 70 Bbls Theophilus Chace 170 Barrels one watch a shore on Liberty so Ends

Monday September the 27<sup>th</sup> Commences with strong winds and squally weather from West to S. W. middle and latter part the same 4 ships laying off and on shipped a cook and 1 man sent one man ashore sick Jerik Rodgers so Ends

Tuesday Sep. the 28<sup>th</sup> Begins with strong winds and squally middle part the same at 8 A. M. up Anchor and made sail winds variable several sail in sight middle part squally steering E. S. at 12 P. M. Close Reef. the top sails and furled the fore sail ~~so Ends~~ at day light made sail so Ends

Lat By Obs. 38. 23 N. Long 30. 25

Wednesday Sep 29<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh breezes from the N. steering S. E. middle part the same latter part squally Close Reef. the top sails and furled the fore sail so Ends

Lat. By Obs. 38. 04 N. Long 26. 40 W

Thursday Sep 30<sup>th</sup> Begins with strong gales from the N. W steering E. N at 1 P. M. have too heading to the Northward S. Michael in sight Bearing E. N. E Distance 15 leagues middle part the same at day light made sail steering E. N. so Ends
