

Remarks on Board the Brig Leonidas

Saturday January the 1st 1842 Commences with strong winds from East to N. E. equally steering N. W. & N. at sun set shortened sail to the S. E. middle and latter part the same so Ends one man sick

Lat. By Obs. 12. 57 N Long. 54. 15 West

Sunday Jan. the 2nd Begins with strong Gale from the N. E. equally heading to the S. E. at 1 P. M. more to the North at 4 P. M. steered N. N. W. middle and latter part the same let a reef out of the top sails so Ends one man sick

Lat. By Obs. 13. 46 N. Long. 56. 12 W

Monday Jan. 3rd Comm. with strong winds from the E. N. E. steering N. N. W. at 1 P. M. let a Reef out steering N. W. & N. middle and latter part the same so Ends

Lat By Obs. 14. 19 N Long 58. 56 W

Tuesday Jan. 4th Begins with strong winds from the E. N. E. steering West middle part the same at 4 A. M. made the Island of Martinico steering down the S. W. side of the Island the Captain Baker went Ashore so Ends started 1 Barrel of Reef

Wednesday Jan. 5th Comm. with fresh Breezes lying off and on at 5 P. M. the Boat returned middle and latter part light Baffling winds equally standing to the Northward Dominica in sight so Ends

Lat By Obs.

Jan 6th Begins with light winds variable squally standing along the Island of Dominica middle and latter part the same saw Black fish lowered the S. Boat struck took him Aboard so Ends one sail in sight

Remarks on Board the Brig Leonidas

Friday January the 7th 1842 Commences with light Baffling winds beating up to the Island at 7 P. M. let go the Anchor in 7 Fathoms water Employed at various jobs so Ends one man sick the Cambrian of Boston come to Anchor about 1 hour before 10

Saturday Jan. the 8th Begins with light winds and equally to Anchor under the lee of Dominica Employed Bailing the Blackfish washing ship and sent a raft of Casks a shore for Water sent men Ashore to cut wood James Rodgers John Thompson and Nathaniel Chace the did not assist to cut nor to carry the wood to the Beech. Captain Baker asked Rodgers what he run of for and not assist to wood ship he said he would go where he pleased. Captain Baker put him in Irons he used such Abusive Language so Ends one man sick

Sunday Jan 9th Comm. with light winds from Eastward squally variable weather Rodgers took the Irons of at Night Captain Baker sent for Rodgers and asked him who took of the Irons he said took them of himself. Captain Baker told him he was going to take of the Irons but since he took them of without orders he would put them on again he said he would do his Duty and Befuse himself and he was sorry Captain Baker was going to put on the Irons and he run forward and swore he would be Damned if his words be put in Irons we went forward to take him off and he swore he would be put in Irons Captain Baker and I. and Mr. Baker took hold of him to carry him off and John Welch told us of Captain Baker and said it was against the Laws of States to put a man in Irons Mr. Baker hauled for he let go Captain Baker we took Rodgers and put on and he sung out if there was any man on Board put him in Irons David the sick man stole were Intoxacated I told the Crew to put up the water on Board and John Welch said he Duty on Board
