Thursday March the 10th 1842 Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E. steering West a middle part the same latter part to the W. S.W. so Ends one man sick

Friday March the 11th Begins with fresh breezes from the N. S.E. standing to the N. S.W. at 1 P.M. saw a Breach it was sperm whales lowered got 2 to the S Boat cut them in at 12 M saw more whales and lowered so Ends.

Saturday March the 12th Comm. with fine Pleasant in chase of whale struck got 4 whales 2 to the S Boat 2 to the L. Boat several whale went of spouting Blood midd part fine weather Boiling at day light comm. cutting so Ends

Sunday March the 13th Begins with fine weather cutting east in the Body's and lay by the heads and comm. Boiling middle part the same at day light hove in the heads made sail a steam Boat and a sail passed us so Ends

Monday March the 14th Comm. with light winds from the South standing to the East. Boiling middle and latter part to the S.E. so Ends

Latt By Obs. 28. 34 N Long 87. 36 W

Tuesday March the 15th Begins with light winds from the west. variable steering W. S.W. Boiling finished Boiling squally from the Northward close Reef the top sails and spurl'd the fore sail and hove to middle and latter part the same heading from W. N.W. to N. N.W. started 1 Bbl of Flour and 1 Beef so Ends

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Wednesday March the 16th 1842 Comm. with strong breeze from the N. E. heading to the N. N.W. at 6 P.M. to the Southward set the fore spencer at day light comm. stowing Down finished stowing Down stowed Down Barrells so Ends

Thursday March the 17th Begins with strong Gale from the Eastward at half past Meridian wore to the Northward at sun set shortened sail at 12 A.M. wore to the South at day light made sail 3 sail in sight one man sick so Ends

Latt By Obs. 27. 56 N Long 89. 10 W

Friday March the 18th Commences with fresh breezes from the Eastward standing to the South squally at 2 P.M. Reef top sails and took in the fore sail wore to the N. N.W. at 2 A.M. wore to the South at day light made sail at 2 A.M. wore to the N. E. 2 sail in sight one man sick so Ends

Latt By Obs. 28. 04 N Long 89. 13 W

Saturday March the 19th Begins with light breezes from the Eastward standing to the N. E. spoke the America of Wareham took 4 whales since we saw them last. hails 340 Barrells several sail in sight at sun set shortened sail at day light made sail tacked to the South Captain Baker saw James Rodgers heave a piece of Cork over board we let the America have 3 Bushels of Iron Hoops so Ends

Sunday March the 20th Commences with light winds from the Eastward standing to the South at sun set shortened sail at 12 A.M. wore ship to the N. E. at day light made sail 3 sail in sight so Ends
