at 7 P.M. William Ward a boat Steerer barted
This Ship after being Sick 25 days he was
a Native of New Haven Connecticut Latter
part fine with and I broke the No side cruma
And the Captain Came on board So ends
This 24 Curs
Lat by Observation 10° 16' S Long 45° 24' E

Monday June the 26 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Light breezes
From the S S W and some squally
And at 5 A.M. beried William Ward
in Canby with the No side cruma at 6
A.M. Strong breeze and Squally took in
The gill and main sail and Clost reef
The topsail Middle and Latter part the
Same So ends this 24 Curs
Lat by Observation 10° 12' S Long 43° 41' E

Tuesday June the 27 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Strong winds and
Squally at 6 P.M. Sut the gill and main sail
Middle and Latter part the Same So ends
This 24 Curs
Lat by Observation 10° 11' S Long 42° 28' E

Wednesday June the 28 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Strong breezes
From the S S E Steering S W by W
at 3 A.M. Shuck a reef out of the sails at 10
A.M. wore Ship at 12 A.M. Clost reef the
Topsails at 2 P.M. wore Ship at 4 P.M. wore Ship
So ends this 24 Curs
Lat by Observation 10° 18' S Long 40° 57' E

Thursday June the 29 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Strong breezes
From the S S W and Shuck a reef out
Of the topsails at 5 A.M. wore the Eastern
A reef and wore Ship at 10 A.M. Clost reef
The fore topsail at 2 P.M. wore Ship at 10 Shuck
a reef out of the fore topsail So ends this 24 Curs

Friday July the 30 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Strong breezes
And variable and reef and Caried away
The bow S. lid S. side and in Side of the
Land at 4 A.M. wore Ship at 6 A.M. tack
Ship and Shuck the reef out of the topsails at 12 P.M.
Tack Ship at 6 P.M. Single reef the topsails
Latter part the Same So ends this 24 Curs
Lat by Observation 10° 43' S Long 41° 11' E
