These 24 Curs begins with Strong breezes
From the S.W. and too up too Stand mast
Head and at 6 A.M. Clost reef the topsails and
Took in the gill Middle and Latter part the
Same So ends this 24 Curs
Lat by Observation 10.43 S Long 41.57 E

Sunday July 2nd 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Strong breezes
From the S.W. at 6 A.M. Clost reef topsails
at 6 P.M. Shook the reef out of the main
Topsail and gone out of the fore topsail at 10
P.M. made the island of Cormor bore South
Distance 25 miles So ends this 24 Curs
Lat by Observation 11.37 S Long 42.41 E

Monday July 3rd 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Strong breezes
And ruff at 6 A.M. tack Ship Middle
And Latter part the Same So ends this
24 Curs
Lat by Observation 11.25 S Long 41.64 E

Tuesday July 4th 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Strong breezes
From the S.W. at 6 A.M. tack Ship Middle
But more moderate Latter part the Same
So ends this 24 Curs
Lat by Observation 11.25 S Long 41.64 E

Wednesday July 5th 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Strong breezes
at 3 A.M. Put the main beryallant ad at 11 A.M.
Took it in at 6 P.M. Clost reef the topsails
and made the island of Cormor bearing East
Distance 30 miles at 9 P.M. made the island
Maootta bearing S.S.E. distance 30 miles and
Shook the reef out at 11 Put the fly gill
So ends this 24 Curs
Lat by Observation

Thursday July the 6th 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Light breezes
From the South with bloudy weather
And under all sail at 4 A.M. tack Ship
At 10 A.M. tack Ship at 6 P.M. made the
Island of Hispania bearing E.N.E.
Distance Latter part the Same So ends
this 24 Curs

Friday July 7th 1848

These 24 Curs begins with Light breezes
With fine weather at 1 A.M. hove the lead
And found 11 w bottom at 8 Leard
The boat and hauled her in at 12 P.M.
Let go the anchor in 16 fathome water
Latter part the Same So ends this
24 Curs
