

Saturday July 27th 1848

These 24 Ours begin with pleasant weather and all hands employed in ship duty so ends this 24 Ours

Sunday July 30th 1848

These 24 Ours begin fine weather Sold to the Mendocino 473 barrels of Bread and stowed the Liberty So ends this 24 Ours

Monday July 31st 1848

These 24 Ours begin with fine weather all hands employed in ship duty so ends this 24 Ours

Tuesday July 1st 1848

These 24 Ours begin with fine weather at 7 AM A light breeze from the land and took our Anchor and Steard A.M.W. from Fornah in Cumbray With the Mendocino and the straito Middle part the sea with all sail out so ends this 24 Ours

Wednesday August 2nd 1848

These 24 Ours begin with pleasant weather Stearing E.N.E. under all sail in Cumbray with Mendocino and straito Middle and latter part calm with some men of duty sick so ends this 24 Ours

Thursday August 3rd 1848

These 24 Ours begin with fine weather at 2 AM took in the fly gill and tregalantail and saw a ship at 4 AM Single reef the topsail at 6 AM took in the Bonnet and 6 lost reef the topsail and took in the main sail Middle part the same at 7 PM Set the main sail and struck a reef at 7 PM Laid the Boats for humpbacks and got Nothing so ends this 24 Ours

Friday August 4th 1848

These 24 Ours begin with Light breezes And fine with out the main tregalantail and single fly gill Middle part the same so ends this 24 Ours
Lat by Observation 11° 30' S Long 46° 36' E

Saturday August 5th 1848

These 24 Ours begin with light breezes from the South Stearing E by N with fine weather Middle and latter part the same so ends this 24 Ours
Lat by Observation 11° 00' S Long 45° 08' E

Sunday August 16th 1848

These 24 Ours begin Light breezes from the South Stearing E.S.E. by the wind Middle part Calm latter part light breezes so ends this 24 Ours
Lat by Observation 10° 44' S Long 45° 14' E

Monday August 17th 1848

These 24 Ours begin with Light breezes from the South Calm Middle and latter part the same So ends this 24 Ours
Lat by Observation 10° 00' S

Tuesday August 18th 1848

These 24 Ours begin with Light breezes from the S.E. Stearing E by the wind some saw breaches Middle and latter part the same So ends this 24 Ours
Lat by Observation 10° 34' S Long 45° 04' E
