

Seven men demand the
services of American Consul
C. A. Chase took charge today.
C. W. Smith going out a boat.

Sunday April 3rd 1904

This day begins thick & raining
at 7:30 am. Kept off ^{from} land &
at 8:30 saw it. Took pilot at
9 & at 10:50 dropped anchor in
ten fathom water in Carlisle
bay.

So ends this day.

Monday April 4th

This day is going has been
moderate & raining. Substantially
to put in new horse pipe & shackled
on again. no one allowed on
shore but C. W. Smith. Holiday
on shore.

So ends.

Tuesday Apr. 5th.

Moderate wind from N.E.
Pleasant weather. American
Consul came on board by
request of crew. Later the Consul
sent the Doctor on board, who
examined the men. the Doctor also
sent medicine to the crew.
at four P.M. Oneil, Johnson
& others refused to work. demanding
shore leave.

So ends this day.

Started one barrel beef
" " " "

Adelia Chase got under weigh
today. fouled & carried away. Willborn
anchored again.

Ok. Further off the
harbour today.
Adelia Chase got away.

Wednesday April 6th.

Fine weather today with a mod-
erate breeze. unshackled starboard
cable, took out the old horse pipe &
put in another, then went on chain
again. sent Antoine J. Philip Phillips,
J. J. Roderique, Henry Clay and Andrews
to Consulate by request of the
Consul. at one P.M. sent starboard
watch on shore to stay until tomor-
row morning. took on board gun's
potatoes fowl, juncaphin.

So ends this day

Thursday April 7th.

Moderate trades, took on
board sea stores. starboard watch
came on board with exception of
J. Morse & Chas Reed. sent port
watch ashore at 10 A.M. until tomor-
row morning. Consul discharged
six men. Got steward (Morse) aboard
at 11 A.M.

So ends.

Friday Apr. 8th.

Fine weather, stowed away
stores J. Andrews, H. Clay, A. J. Phillips,
A. Smith, J. J. Roderique & Henry
Corrie are discharged & effects sent on
shore. All other men on board except
C. E. Reed. also eight men shipped yes-
terday on board. So ends.
