

Thursday April 21st. 1904

Light breezes today, no rain. crew employed setting up casks. got 2 1/2 cords wood, sent six more casks ashore & filled them with water. painting ship & some iron work. crew ashore (all who cared to go) for the evening.

So ends.

Friday April 22nd

Moderate & clear today, crew employed on casks & painting sent last cask of new gang ashore tonight. Chas. Dasset was fined in court four dollars & costs amounting to \$4.50 Capt. paid fine & he came on board.

So ends this day.

Saturday April 23rd.

Light weather today. employed setting up shoosha emptied new water casks on shore coopered them & refilled. painted upper fore the rail yard & painted some on outside ship got letters from wife & agent of brig. at dusk, warship came in the harbor & anchored. took two casks whale oil on deck & coopered them. ~~nearly~~ all men who cared to go on shore for the evening. warship proved to be German.

So ends.

Harry Stevens did not
come on board today.

Started barrel brig

Sunday April 24th.

Light variable winds, with calm at daylight a German warship came to an anchor. at four P.M. still another came in. at 6 P.M. the three got under weigh & steered to westward. Leonora's crew ashore with exception of Capt. cook & eight men forward.

So ends this day.

Monday April 25th.

Light S.W. wind, dry weather. employed setting up shoosha. got one cask water from shore to use on board, over hauled ships pumps. also capstan. Harry Stevens had not been on board today.

So ends this day.

Tuesday Apr. 26th.

Light N.E. trades dry & hot through the day. rain showers in evening. employed flagging casks, dried & aired the sails. sent ashore & filled casks set up. L. Adams, E. Jackman & G. Mapp, did not return to the ship this day. T. Simon & Wm. Corke & C. Cumberbatch also over stayed their time on shore. So ends this day.

*Stevens turned up last
night at 9 P.M.
Let Mr. Jansen go ashore to stay
a few days for his health.
