

Tuesday May 10th. 1904

Pleasant weather, fresh breeze. employed rafting water. got two cords wood. sent upper fore topsail. Mr. Wheeler went ashore to doctor his foot. did not want to go to the doctor with the Capt. repaired, cracks.

So ends this day.

Wednesday May 11th.

Moderate today wind S.W. employed getting water. got one cord wood. waited ashore for the evening. Mr. Wheeler on duty today.

So ends.

Thursday May 12th.

Very light N.W. wind. F. Roosner got away at daylight. came back at 4 P.M. Mate & Boatheader came aboard at 3 P.M. Mr. Wheeler & Fred Cooper on shore without leave. Steward deserted last night.

So ends.

Friday ~~Thursday~~ May 13th
Commences with light winds the ship still at anchor the Capt. went ashore at 9 A.M. and returned at 3.30 P.M. the middle and latter part of the day the weather the same hands in island in general south

So ends

Saturday May 14th
Commences with light winds from the N.W. the ship still at anchor the middle part the weather the same at 9 A.M. hoist sail and lased the sails at 7 P.M. the wind hauled to the E. and took on anchor and proceed to sea under all sail at the B.E. Wheeler has 10 coats 10 pieces of blankets a coil of twine the latter part of the day the weather the ship heading N.W. by E. under all sail

So ends

Sunday May 15th
Commences with light variable winds and clear weather the ship heading N.W. by E. the middle part the weather the same at 5 P.M. the latter part of the day the weather the same at 5 P.M.

Monday May 16th

Commences with light S.E. winds and clear weather the ship heading N.W. by E. under all sail at day the raised last instruction the ship N.W. by E. at 9 P.M. drop anchor in shelter the E. of which ashore at 10 at 11 returned with the command at 9 P.M. took on anchor and stood to sea the ship heading N.W. by E. the latter part the weather the same received 10 barrels of potatoes and 2 more
