employment in general work
so ends

Sunday June th 5
Commenced with a fine breeze from the
S.W. and clear weather the ship
heading to the E. and the middle and
latter part of the weather the same the
ship S.E. by E. under short sail
so ends this day of our Lord

Monday June th 6
Commenced with a fine breeze from
the S.W. with rain squalls the ship
heading S.E. by E. at 5 A.M. under sail
the middle part of the day clear weather
the latter part the same hands employed
in repairing sails John Leapes up duty
sick with morale fever so ends

Tuesday June th 7
Commenced with a fine breeze from the
S.W. and clear weather the ship steering
different courses at day late under sail
the middle and latter part the weather
the same hands employed in repairing
sails so ends

Wednesday July th 8
Commenced with a fine breeze from the
ward and smothery weather the ship
heading to the W. the middle part late winds
the latter part the weather the same
at sun down shorten sail hands
employed in general work
so ends

Thursday June th 9
Commenced with light winds and smothery
weather at sunrise made sail the
ship heading to the N. and E. and the
middle and latter part the weather the
same hands employed in general
work so ends

Friday June th 10
Commenced with a fine breeze from the
ward breezy the ship heading by W.
at day late made sail the middle part of
day strong breeze from the N.E. and rain
squalls at 4 P.M. moderate gale headed
the late sails and upper topsail and
four course and kept the ship W.W. by
at 6 took the 3 L.B. up and the upper
fleet the latter part of the day the weather
in some hands employed in general work
so ends

Saturday June th 11
Commenced with a gale from the N.E.
the ship had to on the starboard tack
the middle part of the day late winds
from the N.E. at 6 P.M. made sail all sail
kept the ship W.W. by the latter part the
weather the same hands employed in
general work so ends

Sunday June th 12
Commenced with a strong breeze from
the S.W. and smothery weather the ship
heading W.W. by W. at day late set the four
course and upper topsail the middle and
latter part of the day the weather the
same at sun down shorten sail
John Leapes returned to duty
so ends this day of our Lord
