

Monday June th 13 1904
Commences with a strong breeze
from the S.W. and smothering the ship
hiding W.M. off at 6 A.M. set the four
cords and jib the middle part of the
day moderate gale the ship in different
tacks at 4 P.M. hoisted the four cords
and jib the latter part the weather
the same so ends

Tuesday June th 14
Commences with a moderate gale
from the S.W. the ship have to over
the starboard tack at 2 P.M. the
wind halled to the N.E. with heavy
rain the middle part the weather the
same the latter part more moderate
set the four cords and main sail reaper
the ship hiding on different cords
hands imployed in general work
so ends

Wednesday June th 15
Commences with a fine breeze from
the N.E. and foggy at 6 A.M. sail
and keep the ship S the middle
part clear weather the latter part the
weather the same at 7 P.M. shorten sail
hands imployed in general work
so ends

Thursday June th 16
Commences with a fine breeze from
the N.E. and clear weather the ship lying
on the Port tack at 5.30 A.M. main sail
at 6 took ship the middle part of day
the wind from the E.S.E. the ship
hiding W.M. the latter part the
weather the same hands imployed in
breaking out and fixing blubber room
so ends

Friday June th 17
Commences with a strong E. the ship
on the starboard tack at 2 P.M. the wind
halled to the S.W. with rain and fog
squalls the middle and latter part
of the day the weather the same.
hands imployed in repairing sails at one
down shorter sail so ends

Saturday June th 18
Commences with a strong breeze from
the S.W. with rain and fog squalls
at 3 P.M. the wind halled to the N.W.
at 6 main sail and kept the ship
S.W. the middle part of the day the
weather the same at 2 P.M. kept
her N.E. the latter part let her come
to the wind on the port tack hands
imployed in breaking out weather and
servings so ends

Sunday June th 19
Commences with a strong N. wind
with fog squalls the ship standing on
different cords the middle part the weather
the same at 6 A.M. main sail the latter
part the weather the same
so ends this day up our Land

Monday June th 20
Commences with a fine breeze from the
N.E. and clear weather the ship sailing
to the S and W. at 6 A.M. main
sail the middle and latter part of
the day the weather the same
hands imployed in general work
at dark shorten sail
so ends
