

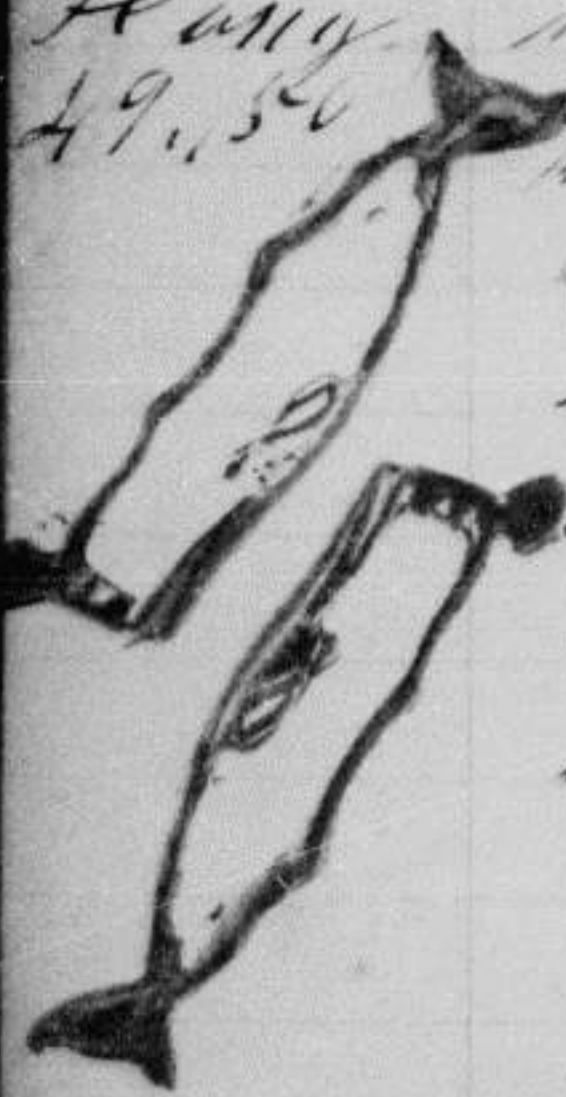
Wednesday June th 29 1964
Commences with a fine breeze from
the S.S.W. with rain squalls at 6 AM
mailed sail the ship heading to the
Windward the middle part the
weather clear the latter part the sun
hands employed in general work at
sundown shortened sail so ends

Thursday June th 30
Commences with a fine breeze from
the S.S.W. and clear weather the ship
heading to the Windward the middle
part the weather the same at 6 PM
mailed sail at 1 PM took ship and
stood to the Southward the latter
part the winds hands employed in general
work so ends

Friday July th 1
Commences with a calm and clear weather
the middle part of the day the same the
latter part the winds from the N.W.
hands employed in repairing sails and
relaying the L.B. at dark shortened sail
so ends this day

Saturday July th 2
Commences with a fine breeze from the
N.W. and clear weather at 5 PM raised
Whales and hoisted all boats at 6:30 AM
S.B. stretch the other boats chased up
at 10 AM took the Whales along side
and sent the boat off at 11 AM the S.B.
stretch at 11:30 took the Whales along
side at 1 PM the other boats came
aboard got dinner and commenced work
at dark ship calling at 12 midnight
started the works Lord Pitman
returned to duty so ends
Schooner in site

Sunday July th 3
Commences with fine weather at 5 AM
started to cut at 10 finished and
cleared up decks the middle part of the
day the weather the same mailed sail
the latter part calm so ends the day
over so ends

Monday July th 4
Commences with a calm still a boiling
the middle part the weather the same at
4 PM spoke the James B. the
latter part of the day the weather the
same so ends

Tuesday July th 5
Commences with light N.E. winds and
clear weather still a boiling the ship
heading to the Windward at 1:30 PM finished
boiling and cleared up decks the latter part
of the day light airs so ends

Wednesday July th 6
Commences with light variable airs and clear
weather the ship standing on different courses
the middle and latter part of the day the
weather the same hands employed in breaking
out and stowing down so ends this day

Thursday July th 7
Commences with light S. airs the ship
heading to the Windward the middle
and latter part the weather the same
hands employed in stowing down
at dark shortened sail so ends

Friday July th 8
Commences with winds from the S. the ship
heading on different courses the middle part of
the day the weather the same the latter part
the wind more to the W. hands employed
in general work at dark shortened sail
so ends
