

Saturday July th 9 1908
Commences with light variable winds and clear weather the ship heeling on the port tack the middle part fine breeze from the W & soil in site the latter part the weather the same hands employed in general work so ends

Sunday July th 10
Commences with a fine breeze from the W and clear weather the ship standing on different tacks the middle part comes the latter part the weather the same so ends day of our Lord

Monday July th 11
Commences with light variable winds the ship heeling to the Wind W. at 6.30 the wind halled to the S.E. with rain squalls the middle part the weather the same at 1 P.M. raised Whales at 3.30 land 3 boats at 5.00 the L.P. boat at 6.30 the L.P. struck and the Whale rolled the boat over and lost the whale at 7.30 take the boat safe the latter part of the day light variable winds so ends

Tuesday July th 12
Commences with light variable winds the wind squally weather the middle part light winds from the W the ship on different tacks looking for the Whale at 7.15 pick up a boat blowing to the S. E. on the ship's deck only the cabin contains Charles E. Liggett, Noah Joseph & Lawson, St. Vincent, W. P. Manuel, Galgate Bravo C. W. Andrew J. Casner, C. J. John Diaz Bravo, Robert D. de England the latter part light winds hands employed in breaking and so ends

Wednesday July th 13
Commences with light variable winds and clear weather at 6.00 the ship heeling on different tacks the middle part fine breeze from the S.W. the latter part light winds at dark shorter soil hands employed in general work so ends

Thursday July th 14
Commences with light S.W. winds and clear weather the ship heeling on different crew at 6.00 the soil at 12 midday raised Whales at 1.20 the boat at 3.30 struck at 5.00 the whale along side and got ready to cut at 6.00 commenced to cut at dark struck down for the night the latter part of the day fine weather so ends

Friday July th 15
Commences with fine weather at 5.00 started to cut at 6.00 finished both haling the case over board and cleared up decks at 9.30 started the work the latter part light winds so ends

Saturday July th 16
Commences with light W winds and clear weather the ship standing on different crew still a haling at 6.00 the soil the middle part fine breeze the latter part light winds so ends

Sunday July th 17
Commences with light W winds and clear weather the ship on the starboard tack under short sail at 5.00 raised Whales at 5.30 land the boat at 6.30 struck at 11.00 the whale along side and commenced to cut at dark the latter part of the day squally hands employed in clearing away boat the L.P. stove so ends
