Tuesday Augth 23
Commences with a strong W wind with heavy rain squalls still aboiling at 11 A.M. finished boiling and cleared up decks the middle part clear weather the latter part the wind better the N.E. so ends

Wednesday Augth 24
Commences with light N.E. winds and clear weather the ship heading to the S and E ward at 6 a.m. and the middle part fine breeze the ship heading to the N. the latter part tide winds hands employed in repairing the lower four topsoil and cooping oil so ends

Thursday Augth 25
Commences with light winds from the N.E. evening to the E ward with rain the ship closed hauled on the Standard tack the middle part clear weather at dusk shorten sail the latter part light winds hands employed in stowing down an. so ends

Friday Augth 26
Commences with light E winds the ship heading to the West E ward at day the main sail the middle part the weather the same the latter part the weather the same at dusk shorten sail hands employed in repairing sails so ends

Saturday Augth 27
Commences with a fine breeze the ship heading on the standard tack at 5.30 A.M. raised anchors at 6 a.m. the S.P.L.B. W.B. at 9 the captain laid in the B.B. at 1.30 P.M. the W.B. struck at 9.30 took the whole along side the latter part late W winds so ends

Sunday Augth 28
Commences with light W.S.W. winds and clear weather at 6 A.M. commenced to cast 6 P.M. finished and got the case ready to haul the middle part the day the weather the same at 6.30 started the work the latter part the weather the same so ends

Monday Augth 29
Commences with a fine breeze from the S.W. at 7 A.M. kept the ship E by S at 12 noon kept her to the N.W. at 3 P.M. kept her E by S at dusk shorten sail still a boiling the latter part the ship lying aback under short sail so ends

Tuesday Augth 30
Commences with a fine S.W. breeze at 6 a.m. main sail and kept the ship S.E. by E still a boiling the middle part of the day the weather the same the latter part the weather fine so ends

Wednesday Augth 31
Commences with a fine breeze from the S.W. the ship heading E.S.E. still a boiling at 7 A.M. finished boiling and cleared up at 4 P.M. sent down the four topsoil and sent up a new one the latter part fine weather hands employed in bending sails and cooping oil so ends
