

Saturday March 4th. 1915

Today light to fresh breezes from S & S.W. the brig under all sail on opposite tacks. saw porpoise, cut squid, & just before dark three finbacks. watch employed straining fresh water & filling salt water & fluting meat. Mr. Johnson feeling rather better today. At dark took in top gallant & upper foresail. So ends this day

Sunday March 5th.
Moderate South wind today, saw a few cut squid. Brig under all sail on opposite tacks.

Monday 6th.
Fresh Trades, brig on opposite tacks under all sail until 4 P.M. when furled light sail, saw cut squid & after 4 P.M. many black birds. Lat. S. 17-02 Lon. E. 9-26

Tuesday 7th.
More moderate today but fresh for most part, cruising in different tacks top gallant sail furled. saw nothing. Lat. S. 17-20 Lon. E. 8-50 E

Wednesday 8th.

A.M. inclined to be moderate P.M. strong breeze from S. saw one pair cut squid & a few black birds. Lat. 17-18 S. Lon. 8-40 E. Brig on opposite tacks all sail until 5 P.M.

Thursday, March 9th. 1915

Fresh & sky overcast more or less A.M. all sail out P.M. under short sail running a little free to E. saw sunfish only.

Lat. 17-23 S. Lon. 9-30 E.

Friday 10th.

Fresh Trades & not too clear saw nothing. brig under short sail steering to W. E. on different courses.

Lat. 17-20 Lon. 9-47

Saturday 11th.

Moderate today saw cut squid & very few black birds. also sunfish. So ends.

Lat. S. 16-40 Lon. E. 9-30

Sunday 12th.

A.M. Calm. P.M. good whole sail breeze & smooth. Saw blackfish & porpoise; also one grampus. several pieces cut squid. no birds. school fish (yellowtail) but could catch none.

16-28 S. Lon. 9-40 E.

Monday 13th.

A.M. moderate P.M. strong. saw porpoise & cut squid. Mr. Johnson about the same sits in chair on deck warm sunny days only. Lat. S. 16-02 Lon. E. 10-30
