March 14th

Strong breeze & heavy swell
wind dying out & leaving swell.
at dark nearly calm. saw cut squid
birds & half dozen large albatross.
land in sight at sunset.

Lon. 11-20 E.

15th, Wednesday.

A. M. calm. P. M. moderate
breeze from S.W. saw cut squid
birds & few fish. after 4 P. M. saw
land.

Lat. 15-21 S.

Lon. 11-35 E.

16th, Thursday

This day comes in with a mod-
S.W. wind at 6.30 A.M. died out calm
& breezed up again at 11 A.M. at
7 A.M. saw land. at 11.30 A.M. Capt
took launch boat & crew & went into
the harbor at Little fish bay. ship
laying off in charge of Mr. Eldredge
boat returned at 4 P.M. with letters
from home. stood off shore until
dark under ordinary sail. then
shortened sail for the night.

So Ends.

Friday 17th.

Moderate from S.W. saw much
cut squids, porpoise, & fish. also one
finback. caught & salted two barrels
albatross. steering to north.

Lat. 8-14 18 Lon. 11-18

Strong breeze & heavy swell
wind dying out & leaving swell.
at dark nearly calm. saw cut squid
birds & half dozen large albatross.
land in sight at sunset.

Saturday 18th.

First half very light air from S. latter
part good breeze from S.S.W. saw one
whale carcass & a school blackfish today.
Employed setting up shooks ^{drinking} for water.
Mr. Johnson on deck most of day sitting
in reclining chair. his appetite not as
good as usual.

Lat. 12-58 S. Lon. 11-18 E.

Sunday 19th.

Light S. wind all day. saw three
finbacks, one bone shark. also grampse
Mr. Johnson failing. very little appetite
on deck in reclining chair all day.

Lat. 11-47 S. Lon. 11-30 E.

Monday 20th.

Light breeze from S.W. today. saw
porpoise. Mr. Monnier fell from furling
middle stay sail last night hurt him but
little but hurt Mr. de. Mills in small
of back, so that he is laid up today.
Employed setting up & flagging off shooks.
So ends.

Mr. Johnson took quite a lot of nour-
ishment today.

Lat. 8-40-41 E. Lon. 11-58

Tuesday 21st.

Light air & calm. saw porpoise.
caught a diamondfish. finished
flagging gang shooks & stowed them away.

Lat. 9-58 Lon. 12-10
