

Wednesday March 22nd.

Light N.W. to N.E. air. saw quite a number of finbacks.

Injured man on duty S. Lat. 9-22 Lon. E. 12-18

Thursday 23rd.

A.M. calm. P.M. light breeze from W. saw many finbacks, porpoise, fish. at 5 P.M. saw land. Mr. Johnson on deck in chair all day. not much appetite.

S. Lat. 9-18 Lon. E. 12-30

Friday 24th.

Ran by lights last night off St. Paul at 5 A.M. wind from off the land. got sea breeze at 1 P.M. anchored in sixteen fathoms water at 5:10 P.M. forty five fathoms ^{shackle} on windlass.

Saturday 25th.

Laying at anchor at mouth of harbor. Capt. & boat crew went ashore at 7:30 A.M. & returned at 5:30 P.M. got fifteen pumpkins.

Sunday 26th.

Fine day still at anchor. At 5:30 A.M. Capt. went ashore & brought off milk, eggs, cabbage & potatoes. All very dear. a poor place here to get recruits. Mr. Johnson drank milk & drank three eggs beaten beside fist, but overeat as was distressed after eating. ^{Mr. Johnson} let the cook go on shore to return at 4:30 P.M. but he did not come.

Monday March 27th.

Fine weather today. Capt. & boat crew went ashore at 5:30 A.M. & got some cabbage eggs. etc. Clearence & Bill of health came aboard by Capt. of Port. Boat at 4 P.M. and we got under way soon after. at 7 P.M. heading N.W. by the wind.

Put Antonio Ramos & Frank Alva in irons this P.M. noon for fighting.

So ends.

Frank Ramos cook has not shown up so had to leave him.

Tuesday 28th.

Moderate from S.W. saw blackfish. Brig under all sail on western tack. Two stowaways on board. Took irons off the two men.

Lat. 8-52 S. Lon. 12-04 W.

Wednesday 29th.

Moderate S.W. saw killers. All sail out on western tack. Lat. 8-34 S. Lon. 10-21 E.

Thursday 30th.

Light S.W. saw nothing. All sail by the wind on western tack. Mr. Johnson lies in his chair on deck all day. eats quite a lot.

Lat. 8-8-46'

Friday 31st.

Very light today saw porpoise. Lat. 8-8-48 Lon. E. 8-34-
