April 12 Brig still at anchor. fresh breezes today. all men aboard today shipped the two stowaways & engaged one boatsteerer. Watch ashore for the night. also Mr. Eldredge & Mr. Wheeler. Capt. on board tonight. So ends this day.

13th.

At anchor, took twenty tuns of water & also took aboard potatoes & other vegetables. shipped one boatsteerer & Cooper also one man forward. one watch ashore on liberty for 24 hours (Starboard watch). Mr. Eldredge in charge on board. Capt. ashore tonight.

14th.

Friday.

At anchor. took five tuns water today. Blacksmith on board & put new bands on tiller. put watch ashore on leave for 24 hours. Mr. Eldredge & Mr. Wheeler on shore on leave. Watchman from shore in charge. Capt. on board after 7.30 P.M. sent both ring stoppers to Blacksmith shop.

Saturday 15th.

Laying in harbor. Mr. Johnson died in hospital at 3.30 P.M. Starboard watch on liberty today.

Sunday 16th.

Fine day. Watch on liberty. The most of the watch & a part of the watch aboard attended the funeral which was in the country.

Monday 17th.

Fine day. Cook's ship came in to anchor today. discharging rice & taking water. no one allowed ashore. a few men not turned up.

Tuesday 18th.

Got all men aboard except those who shipped here. E. Thomas, boatsteerer, went to doctor this morning & it is doubtful if he proceeds in the ship.

Wednesday 19th.

Fine weather today. Got all hands aboard about 12 M. except Thomas who returned his advance money & was discharged. found 3 stowaways & sent them ashore at 2.30 P.M. got under weigh at 5 P.M. found two more stowaways.

Thursday 20

Fresh breeze today. at 7 A.M. landed the two stowaways then left ship off N.N.W.

Friday 21st.

Fresh breeze today. at 9.30 last night ship was among Spm. whales shortened sail but at daylight saw nothing. made all sail at 7 A.M. & left. Lat. 14. 56 S. Long.
