Nov. 25 Calm all of last night. at daylight got a light air from N.E. course S. saw grampus employed getting out provisions & giving out clothing to the crew.

26th. Calm during last night, with rain. got breeze from S.E. at daylight unsteady during the day with rain squalls (light) at 6 P.M. steady moderate S.E. breeze & clear weather. To end this Sunday with all sail out steering S.W. on the wind.

27 Wind from S.E. to S.S.E. & unsteady. with rain squalls. saw nothing. put towels in packs & also what was left of clothing. Manuel Diaz Ramos off duty from cold. Manuel Gomez with something swollen finger. Domingo ^{with} Pray, Chances, Frank Ramos on duty.

28 Moderate S.W. wind. saw one sail. employed at odd jobs. M. Diaz Ramos on duty. To end.

29 Raining, & with varying winds. saw one sail going to S. being steering to S.S.W. by compass. parted reeving on fore royal at 3 P.M. To end this day.

30 Most part calm. much rain saw one sail. repaired fore royal.

Dec. 1st. Calm & light air. saw one bark & one steamer. also saw porpoise birds fish & one sulphur bottom. employed repairing casks. To end.

2 Calm & squalls of rain with variable winds. saw one bark bound S. To end this day.

Dec. 3rd. Light & breezy from S. saw two sail. also porpoise. fine drizzle by spells & overcast all day. no reliable altitude taken of the sun. $1^{\circ}45' N. Lat. 29^{\circ}15' W. Lon.$

4th. Moderate from Smith rain. 8 AM got rain squall from N. with wind. Calm after 10 AM. saw three steamers & St. Pauls rocks.

5th. Mod. S.S.E. saw one sail. bent new jib top sail & repairing dlor. some new halyards. also made new pendants.

6th. Mod. S.S.E. saw one sail going with us. finished repairing jib top sail & went to work on top gallant sail that was torn.

7th. Mod. S.S.E. saw one steamer & grampus. finished repairing top gallant sail & some new peak halyards. some old ones for throat.

8th. Strong S.E. tacked away from the land at 1 AM. & stood back on southern tack at 4. at 9 AM. and breakers over rocks 11 miles off shore. 19-20 saw land. tacked away at 10.45 & then on short tacks west of the day. carried away main gale gear. put in shackles & set up again. top gallant sail & royal furled. ship went to windward about 4 miles during the day. find chronometer exact to a mile. Latitude $5^{\circ} W. Lon. 35^{\circ} 24' W.$

9th. Fresh trades S.E. big on opposite tack. one bark to leeward of us. one on southern tack. bad lookout for us just at present. saw blackfish. 2 P.M. Lat. $4^{\circ} 16' S. Lon. 35^{\circ} 32' W.$
