May 26th. Moderate S.E. made sail & stood to eastward 8 A.M. saw two sail.
 Lat. N. 1 P.M. breezing on from S.S.E. whitewater 31°-51' reported from aloft but saw nothing
 Lon. W. more. at dark under plain sail ~~with~~
 77°-06' reefed mainsail, heading E. by the wind.
 Antonio Cabral off duty. Enoshea.
 Peter Silvia on duty. Veriata Soares off again with asthma.

So ends this day.

8 P.M. Tumbled all but lower topsail, foresail, foretopmast staysail, main & middle stay sails. steering E.N.E. then N.E. to ease ship.

27th. Stiff S.S.E. saw one steamer & one barkentine, set upper topsail at 2 A.M. Brig sweating some. from five to seven 33°-26' inches per hour. working one pump
 Lon. W. about five hours, during the last twenty 75°-07' four. course N.E. until 2 P.M. then N.E. by N.
 Barometer 29.7. Veriata Soares on duty.

So ends this day.

So ends this Sunday.

28th. Southeaster slackened up during the past night & gradually hauled to S.W. & breezed up very strong by 10 A.M. ship then made W. side of stream. Moderate S.W. saw several steamers. also porpoise. leak in bow steady & ship running smooth.
 Examined bow & decided to keep our course for New Bedford & get there as soon as possible. Steering N.E. by N. 1/2 N.

So ends this day.

May 29 This morning opened ~~with~~ bad weather, after a wild night from 10 P.M. wind N.W. & blowing hard in gusts. have ship to under. goosewing topsail & try sail. saw a steamer making hard work of it. at 1 P.M. today wind went to N.N.E. & blew out at dark saw porpoise, one steamer & a barkentine. pumps carefully attended. ship leaking freely.

30th.

So ends this day.

Lat. N. This day begins with a light breeze from the W.N.W. Calm at 4 P.M. & at 8 got a breeze from S.W. shoal of whales close to ship just at dark. too late to lower for the boats to lower. spoke ship. Pedro ~~Varela~~ Varela. 200 since leaving Dominica. also saw two other whaling schooners, Elena Swift & the other not known. also saw a number of schooners (coasters) & a couple of steamers leak in bow increasing. Course W.N.W. So ends this day. ship inside of stream again, or rather in it.

31st. This day we have a moderate S.S.W. Lat. N. breeze with a smooth sea. at 10 A.M. 36°-51' saw land ahead & at 2 P.M. took a pilot
 Lon. W. on board, off inside Cape Henry. Anchored right off in Hampton Roads at 4 P.M. pumping nearly all the time. So ends this day.

June 1st Moderate to fresh S.W. Today Capt. went to quarantine with Pilot, but doctor would not give pratique, said we must come up with ship. took tug at about 1-30 P.M. & towed to quarantine ground. then got pratique & Pilot & Capt. went ashore & sent message home.
