

Bargee Lexington off Sunday Island

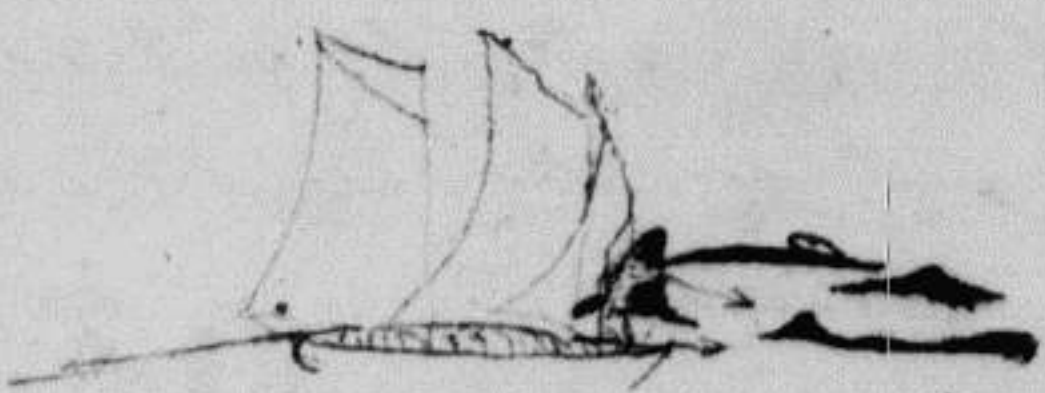
Wednesday the 27th of December 1843
With light winds and fine weather and Goat Island
in sight Middle and Latter part of the wind
calmer and under all sail employed in
tacking the Deck thus ends

Thursday the 28th light air and calm the Curtis
Islands and one sail in sight Middle part the
same at 10 AM saw White Water 10 miles off called
it Whales between the Boats and pulled it in and
found it to be a Rock so we pulled on that & Goat
Island and caught a few dogs thus ends

Friday the 29th light air and calm in under
the lee of Goat Island - Middle part the same
and one Board crew on shore after 10 AM Goat
Island - Latter 2 Boats in at 12 AM came off thus ends

Saturday the 30th light air and calm at 2 PM
the Boat ahead towing out from the Land at
3 PM saw Grampians - a small fair calm
Latter part saw more Grampians and one
sail and a fine breeze from the Southward
thus ends

Sunday the 31st light winds and fine weather
and Sunday Island in sight at 3 PM spoke
the ship L. C. Richardson 30th and 1800 lbs
at 4 PM took in the light sails at 7 PM then
again and started West at 5 PM saw 3 sperm
Whales between and took on L. B. - at 9 PM took
to the S and hauled thus ends

Bargee Lexington off Curtis Island

Monday the 1st of January - 1844
Fine weather and under all sail employed in
boiling thus ends

Tuesday the 2nd fine weather first and middle
part employed in boiling Latter part stowing
down thus ends

Wednesday the 3rd Breeze part stowing down
Middle part standing to the S & S under all
sail Latter part the same thus ends

Thursday the 4th Moderate winds from the
W and fine weather to the S & S under all
sail Middle and Latter part the same
employed in picking over Potatoes thus ends

Friday the 5th Moderate winds from the West and
fine at 3 PM saw 2 gunners at 7 PM saw 2 ships to
the N. W. Middle part the same Latter part
fresh masts and fine had nothing in sight

Saturday the 6th Strong winds from the East
Middle part the same and 4 PM under
short sail Latter part stowing W & W under
all sail at 11 AM saw a sail thus ends

Sunday the 7th Strong winds and clear at
2 PM spoke the ship Bark Sam Chiz a
10th and 350 lbs Spoil at 4 PM saw a mother
sail and the French Rock Middle
part under short sail passed 2 ships
Latter part strong under under short sail
at 8 PM spoke the Cornithian of Bristol
saw 3 other ships thus ends
