

Remarks on board Bark Lexington

Monday January the 8th 1844
Strong Winds and Showers at 2 P.M. Spoke the
Ship of N Bedford 31st and 1950 lbs oil
Middle and Latter part the weather much the
same thus ends

Tuesday the 9th Strong Winds and fine under
Short Sail at 2 P.M. Spoke the Ship of
Providence 30th and 1800 lbs oil Middle
part the same Latter part more showery
at 11 A.M. Spoke the Ship of thus ends

Wednesday the 10th Strong Winds and clear
under Short Sail Middle part the same
Latter part more moderate under all sail and
Sunday in light and 2 sail thus ends

Thursday the 11th Light Winds and fine the Coats
Rocks and Good Hope in sight at 7 P.M. Short
Sail Middle part under Short Sail Latter part
under all sail and on sail in sight thus ends

Friday the 12th Moderate from the south
and light rain under moderate sail
Middle part lying to Latter part under Short
Sail and two other sail standing to the south
at ends

Saturday the 13th fresh winds and clear
under all sail and heaved to the south
Middle part under Short Sail Latter part
fresh winds and Cloudy and 2 sail in sight

Sunday the 14th Strong Winds and foggy
Middle part much the same under Short
Sail Latter part light winds from the N
with Rain and sail in sight thus ends

Remarks on board Bark Lexington

Monday the 15th of January - 1844
Commenced with light baffling winds and rainy
weather - Middle part Strong winds with rain
and under Short Sail Latter part much the same

Tuesday the 16th Strong winds from the East and
Cloudy weather Standing to the south under
Short Sail at 4 P.M. saw Sunday Atlantic bearing
over W at 10 tacked to the south at 5 P.M. locked
and started with under all sail thus ends

Wednesday the 17th fresh winds and clear
heaved to the south under all sail at 6 P.M.
saw pumps at 7 took in the light sail
Middle part the same at 6 P.M. saw a
school of Grampuses called them off Whales bowing
the Boat in pursuit but saw nothing more of them
thus ends

Thursday the 18th fresh winds and fine weather
under Standing in for Sunday Atlantic saw a great
number of Grampuses and pumps at 7 heaved
to the N under Short Sail Middle part the same
Latter part Standing to the south paper Sunday
Atlantic saw more pumps thus ends

Friday the 19th fresh Easterly winds and fine
weather Standing to the south under moderate sail
& and Employed in Calking at 4 P.M. saw Good Hope
Middle part under Short Sail Latter part fine
under all sail Standing to the south at 12 P.M.
passed Easter Rocks thus ends

Saturday the 20th fresh winds and clear
under all sail at 7 P.M. Shortened sail
and spoke the rate of N Bedford Middle
part Cloudy Latter part fine Standing to the
