

Remarks on Hoare's Bank. Lexington

February the 14th 1844 Stormy winds and
fine weather standing to the South at 4 send
down the Main topsail & repair Spinnaker paid
under single reefed topsail eleven paid
Stormy winds and clear Batten paid Stormy
winds and clear at 6 PM send in the file to
repair Employee in sail measuring

Thursday the 15th Stormy, windy and cloudy
steaming to the South under short sail
Missou and Laker paid the sum thus even

By Friday the 16th moderate winds and fine
standing to the South. Several small sail
boats much the same. Latter part fresh winds and
fine. Employed in sail mending then end

Saturday, the 13th Moderate winds from the
 East and fine standing to the South winds
 Short sail at 4 P.M. bent the Old & 3rd sail
 Middle part fine. Latter part the same
 universal sail thus ended. Lat in 33° 46' N.

Monday the 18th moderate winds and from the east to the south at 7 P.M. took in the light sail. Kicker paid much the same. Later, perod foggy, winds all sail

Monday the 18th strong winds from the
East and foggy weather - Hasting to the S
children and Patterson the same

July day the 20th moderate winds from
the N & E and foggy weather heavy to the S & E
winds all sail smaller & latter part
the same thus over Bar 37-25 S

In Ship Leonides

Monday February 17th of 1845

Free and fresh wind, from WSW and clear & rather stormy
and much all drawing fair. Middle part the same
later the wind light & set lower and foggy and raining
said then Enos. Lat. in. 45 - 37.5 Long. in. 115 - 00 Wad

Thursday 18th Breeze calm and the weather clearing to
breeze and heavy at 10. P.M. calm again in the morning. Sail
middle part fresh breeze from S.E. took in the main top gallant
sails. Last strong wind from S.E. took in sail & double reefed
top sail & jib & spinnaker. This evening - 10.5 - 10.5 - 11.3 - 38

Wednesday 17th Very serene and clear weather. barometer
 30.1. Not undisturbed double reef, at 7 P.M. sun moderate
 (lost the reef and set 7.5 main, top gall and jacks, Middle
 the, wind from W. W. set 7.5 main & top gall & main sail.
 Later the weather much the same at 9 A.M. ran away before
 Hudding sail boom sent up another and set the full top in top gall
 and Hudding sail thus Ensl-Luce in 45.0.0. Long 110.14 W

Thursday 20th Strong winds from WSW and foggy weather
 leaving City at 10 AM and snowed ~~at~~ ^{for} twelve "gallant
 trading sails" Michael paid light dues from the Vard and foggy
 Lanes paid for services and foggy, thus over Lac 46-275
 107-2500

Friday 21st Many West by winds and foggy weather Morning
E. S. with all drawing fair. Red tide in part moon
Latter light winds from ex. W. and foggy this day
Lat. in 47° 25' S. Long. in 104° 58' W.

Wednesday 22nd calm & foggy at 4 P.M. heard a few main
top galland sail at 1 P.M. huge from S.E. and bearing
this side said fresh gales and rainy took in jib. Later
close the wind backing to the westward took out our reef
and set the main top galland sail steering E. by S
thence came - Lat in 4th 40. Long 103° 32' W
