

Remarks on Board at Anchor

Tuesday April the 11<sup>th</sup> 1843 fine weather and winds N.E. employed in sweeping for the Anchor and heaving the Bower mending the sheeting &c this end

Wednesday the 12<sup>th</sup> fine weather and employed in getting fresh water Cook ready and filling tubs blocking the beam &c

Thursday 13 fine weather winds N.E. and employed in getting off water blocking the beam &c this end this day

Friday the 14<sup>th</sup> to Sunday the 21<sup>st</sup> employed in mending and water and other jobs this day sailed the Pacific of St. Johns N.B. at 10 AM the watch went on shore this end this day

From the 21<sup>st</sup> to Wednesday the 27<sup>th</sup> the weather rainy and employed in various jobs of work on the 24<sup>th</sup> the Barque Pearl of Cippisambond to sea on the 26<sup>th</sup> had the King on board - this end

Thursday the 28<sup>th</sup> light winds and rainy at 9 AM took our anchor and ran out of the Harbor and made the off side after small anchor and to help English Barque Sussex got out employed in springing up this end

Friday Saturday and Sunday steering to the North with strong winds and rainy

the 10<sup>th</sup> of April

Monday more fine under all sail steering to the North and employed in mending

this end this watched scrawl

Thursday April May the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1843 steering to the North with fresh winds and clear weather and employed in various jobs mending in night and in fact 12-43 & salt

Longitude 10 E

Wednesday the 3<sup>rd</sup> fine weather and fresh winds and steering to the North under all sail and employed in small jobs this end this 24 hours

Latitude 14-40 N

Thursday the 4<sup>th</sup> fresh winds from the N.E. and clear weather and hoisted to the N under all sail Middle and Latter part Much the same at 7 AM sent down the Main sail and had a netter this end

Friday the 5<sup>th</sup> fresh winds and fine weather under hoisted to the N under all sail and employed in mending the Main sail Middle and Latter part fine at 10 AM sent down the Main top sail and sent up a netter and the day was with clothing in sight

Saturday the 6<sup>th</sup> moderate winds and fine weather hoisted to the N under all sail and employed in mending the Main sail - Middle part fine and steering N.W. under all sail Latter part the same this end this day

Sunday the 7<sup>th</sup> light easterly winds and fine weather at 1 PM on land the main sail and had the other and steering N.W. under all sail Middle and Latter part Much the same this end Latitude 21-25

Monday the 8<sup>th</sup> fine easterly winds and fair weather steering N.W. under all sail Middle part cloudy with light rain in the P.M. Latter cloudy and fresh winds at day by 12 took in the Main Board to repair this end Latitude 23-41 N
