

Remarks On Board Friday July 26th 1861

First part fine breeze from S.W. heading W.N.W. at 4 P.M. squally at night put the ship under short sail middle moderate latter strong breezes from E.S.E. steering W by S

Lat 42° 00' N.

Saturday July 27th first part strong breeze from N.E. steering W middle S latter the same

Lat 42° 00' Long 31° 23'

Sunday July 28th moderate gales from S.W. on the starboard tack under easy sail

Lat 41° 22' Long 23° 00'

Monday July 29th fine weather & light breeze from the W. steering on different tacks loaded for black fish spoke a fagat Bark

Tuesday July 30th fine weather & light breezes from the westward steering on diff tacks spoke the Bark Elizabeth of Westport with 80 bbls of

Wednesday July 31st the strong breezes from the W. on diff tacks loaded for black fish

Thursday July 1st Aug 1st fine weather & light breezes from the N. steering on diff tacks the Elizabeth in sight

Friday Aug 2nd strong breezes from S.W. steering N.W. spoke the Bark Didon 15 days from New York bound to Lisbon

Saturday Aug 3rd strong breezes from W. heading W. on diff tacks under easy sail caught a porpoise

Sunday Aug 4th strong breezes from W. with thunder & lightning steering to the S. by the wind under easy sail

Lat 41° 18' N. Long 18° 15'

Monday Aug 5th fine breezes from the W. steering to the S. by the wind loaded for black fish

Tuesday Aug 6th 1861
these 24 hours fine breezes from W. heading S.W. saw several sails

Wednesday Aug 7th this day fine breezes from W.N.W. heading S.W. under all sail nothing in sight so engs this day

Lat 37° 46' N. Long 35° 21' W.

Thursday Aug 8th first part light breezes from W.N.W. heading S.W. middle S latter the same employed in taring down saw a number of ships

Lat 36° 40' S. Long 35° 25' W.

Friday Aug 9th this day begins with fine breezes from S.W. heading S.W. passed the American Bark Powhattan middle & latter on diff tacks set up the main topmast-rigging

Saturday Aug 10th all these 24 hours strong breezes from the westward heading on diff tacks by the wind under easy sail spoke the schooner Varnum of Hull of Providence bound Cap. Breaman 6 months out 140 SP

Sunday Aug 11th Beginning with moderate gales from W.S.W. heading S by the wind at 6 P.M. saw 80 whales 2 miles off 4 points on the weather bow going N.W. did not lower middle & latter strong gales lying to



Monday Aug 12th this day begins with strong winds from N. heading W.N.W. under short sail middle the same latter fine breezes from the W. heading on different tacks loaded for black fish saw a number of sails employed in setting up rigging

Lat 36° 21' N. Long 36° 08' W.

Tuesday Aug 13th first part strong breezes from the West heading to the N. spoke the Bark Spartan of Providence bound Cap. Cook middle & latter strong breezes from W. steering diff courses under short sail

Wednesday Aug 14th strong breezes from the W. steering E.S.E. under short sail middle part the same latter strong breezes from the N. steering to the W.N.W.

Lat 36° 17' N. Long 36° 15' West
